



2016 ROSA PARKS SCHOLARSHIP APPLICATION GUIDELINES

The Council on American-Islamic Relations' (CAIR) annual Rosa Parks Civil Liberties Scholarship honors the life and work of civil rights pioneer Rosa Parks.

This year's winner of the **\$1,000 Rosa Parks Civil Liberties Scholarship** will be announced at CAIR's 22nd annual banquet on Saturday, October 1st, 2016 in Arlington, VA. The winner of the scholarship **must be present** to accept the award. The application deadline for the scholarship is **September 2, 2016**.

Applicants must respond to the following essay question in 500 words or less:

Describe an experience that illustrates your connection to advancing equality in America.

In order to qualify, applicants must:

- **Be enrolled in, or accepted to,** a full-time undergraduate, graduate or professional program of an accredited college or university in the United States for the Fall 2016 semester
- **Be a resident of the DC, Maryland or Virginia area** – either fulltime or during the school year
- **Submit a resume demonstrating an interest** in civil liberties issues and/or community service in past employment or volunteer experiences
- **Submit an application form** (below)
- **Submit a bio** (150 words max)
- **Sign** the Attestation and Application Signature portion of the application
- **Be able to attend CAIR's 22nd Annual Fundraising Banquet on Saturday, October 1st, 2016 to receive the award in person ***
- Submit a complete application by **no later than 5 p.m. on September 2, 2016**

**Please note that the recipient is responsible for their own transportation to and from the event. CAIR will not cover any travel expenses.*
