Poll Summary:

Between October 25 and 28, Strategic Directions conducted a survey of 1,691 randomly selected residents of Nova Scotia to study public awareness and opinions regarding access to cancer medication.

Results:

Results show that more than half (56.6%) of Nova Scotians believe that prescription cancer medication will be paid for by the government. The majority of respondents (71%) indicated that up to \$200 per month was the most that they could manage before facing a financial hardship. If faced with paying for these costly medications themselves, 60% would consider leaving Nova Scotia for another province.

Notes:

Survey responses were presented in random order to compensate for ordering effects.

Results have been weighted to accurately reflect actual Nova Scotian age and gender demographics and can be considered to be accurate within ±2.5%, 19 times out of 20.





- 3. Worse in Nova Scotia, than in other Atlantic Provinces




