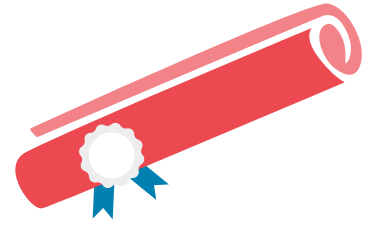
\$925 million

for the Youth Employment Strategy

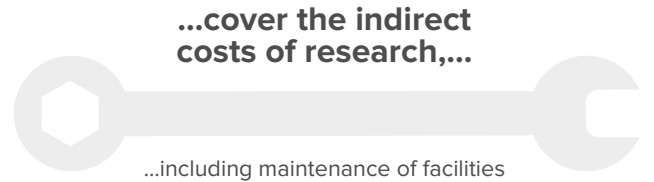
to double the number of government-subsidized summer jobs

for Status of Women Canada to develop a national strategy for...



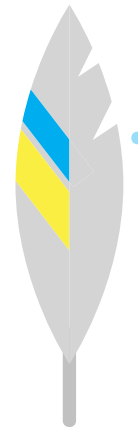
...addressing gender-based violence on post-secondary campuses.
