



CASA of Travis County Volunteer Training

The CASA Volunteer Training Fast Track program consists of 8 in-person 3.5-hour classes on a condensed timeline, an hour of pre-work for each class and 3 hours of courtroom observation (approximately 39 hours total) completed over a 3-week cycle. You must finish all training and observation by the final deadline and all background checks must be completed and cleared in order to be assigned to a case.
