“ In regards to a potential redistricting move for Trinity County, I am strongly in favor of us being aligned with Shasta County. I have lived in Trinity County for nine years, having moved here from Shasta County. We make the trip to Redding two to three times a week, as it is a 50 minute drive from Weaverville. Highway 299 connecting us to Redding went through a major reconstruction project a few years ago to accommodate the high traffic. Weaverville residents do nearly all of their major shopping in Redding, and many residents even commute to Redding for work. Redding is essentially our “hub”. Our children graduate high school and often attend Shasta College, we go there for our doctor and dental visits, to travel further out of state, and many of us have family members living in Redding. Our community was historically founded by people coming up from the valley in search of gold, and it continues to be predominately people from the valley who are moving here in search of the quieter mountain life. We are grouped with Shasta in many other organizations, such as the McConnell Foundation, the Smart Workforce Center, Superior California Economic Development, and Shasta College which operates a campus in Weaverville. In contrast, from Weaverville to Eureka it is over two hours on a narrow and winding mountain road, and we go only two or three times a year, as a day trip. We do not share nearly any common resources or organizations with the coast, or more appropriately, Marin County, with whom we are currently grouped. We do not share the big city thinking, in regards to our natural resources or our priorities. We feel disconnected and underrepresented, making up such a small percentage of the big districts’ voting base. Their goals and ideals do not reflect what we value or see as vital to our community growth and stability. However, the projects and plans made in Shasta County will always more closely affect us, and their way of thinking is naturally more similar to ours, as a rural area. Our lives and hearts are decidedly more closely aligned with Shasta County, and it is time that the district lines fairly represent that. Thank you, Heidi Hauser”
