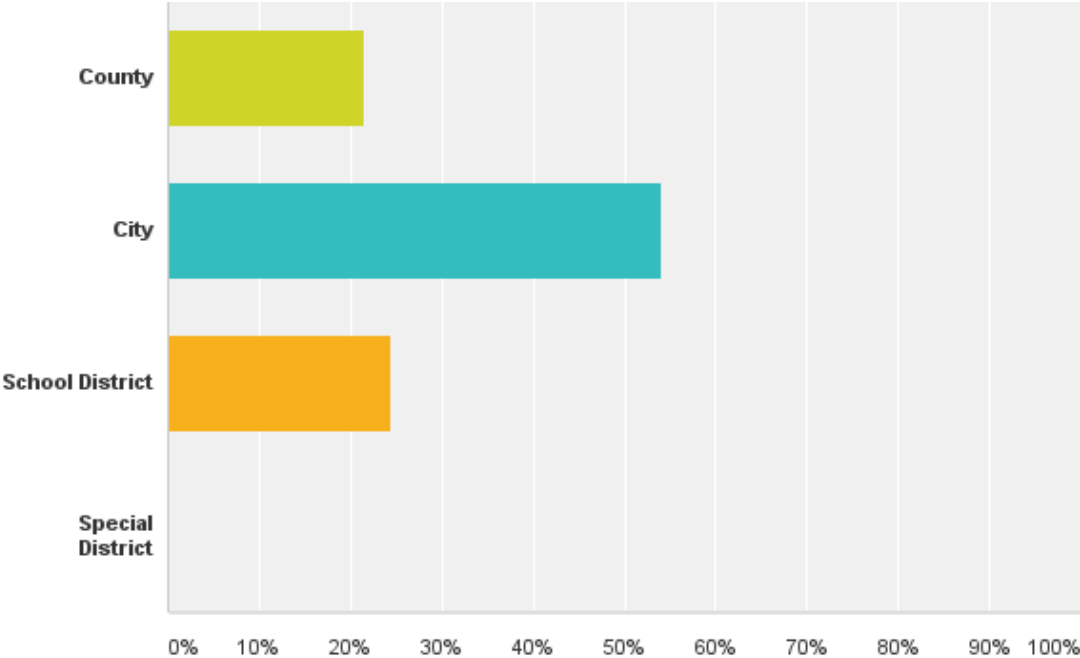


**California Emerging Technology

Government Officials**

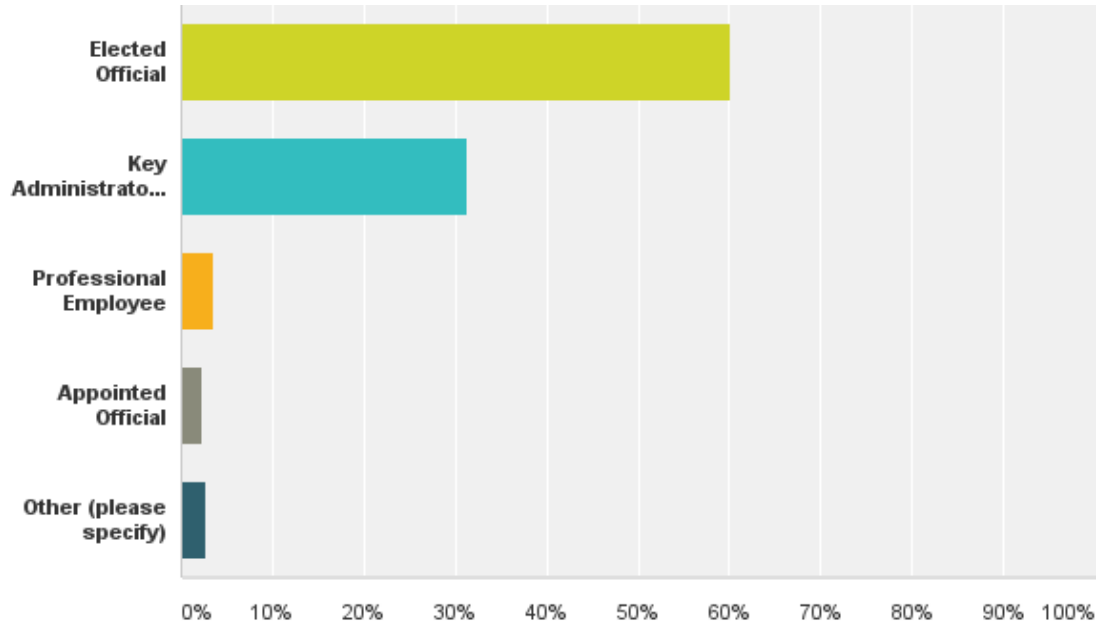

Between September 5 and October 24, 2016 more than **250** local government officials responded...

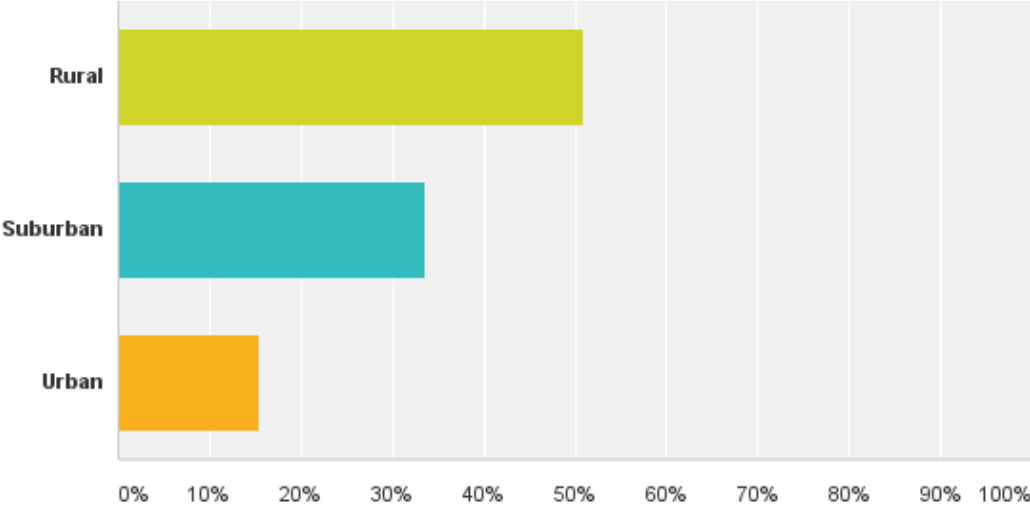
What is your local government jurisdiction?



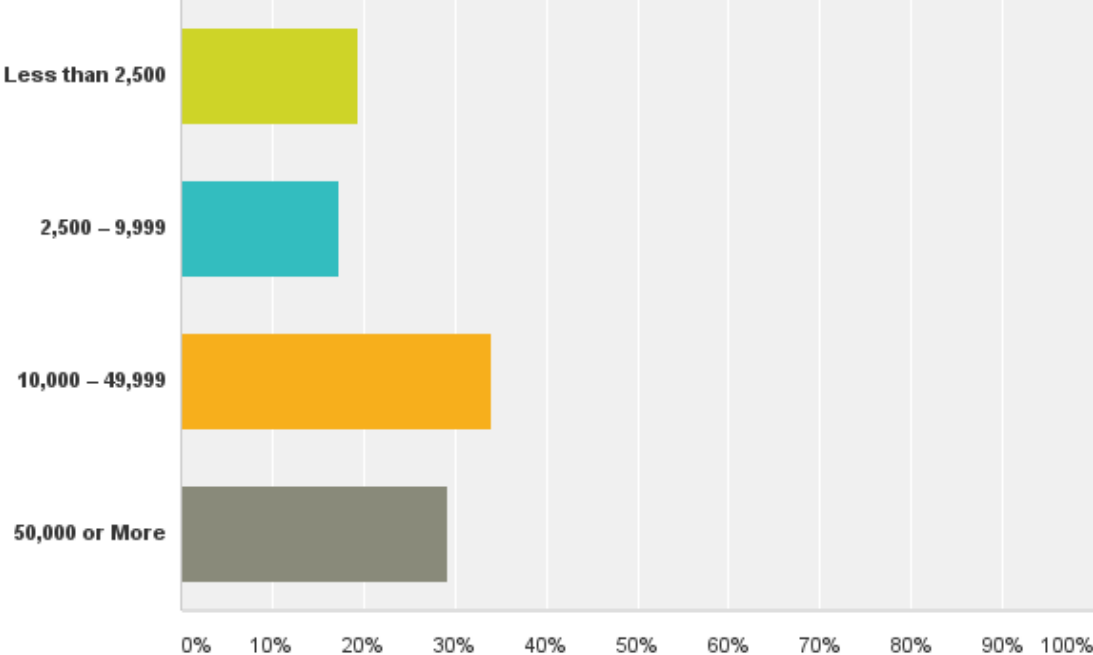
What is your position?



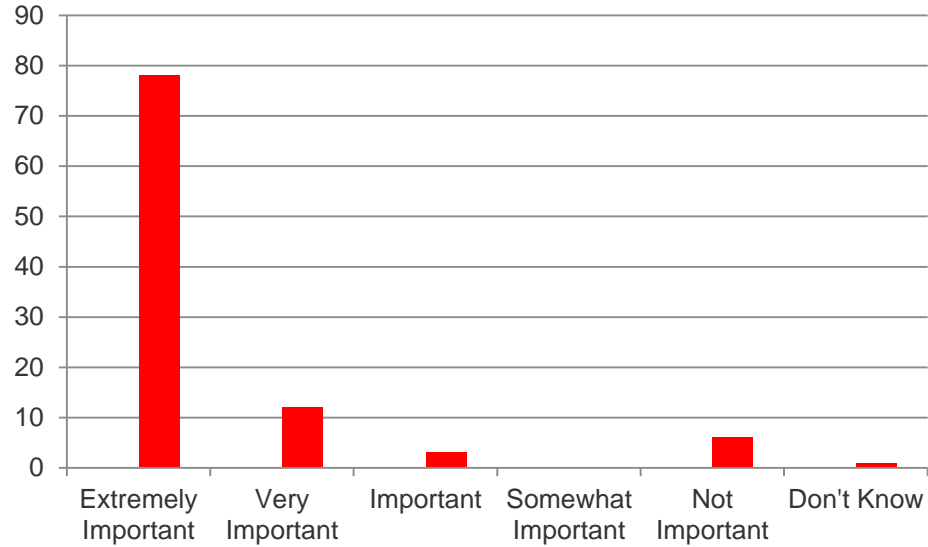
Overall, how do you categorize your jurisdiction?



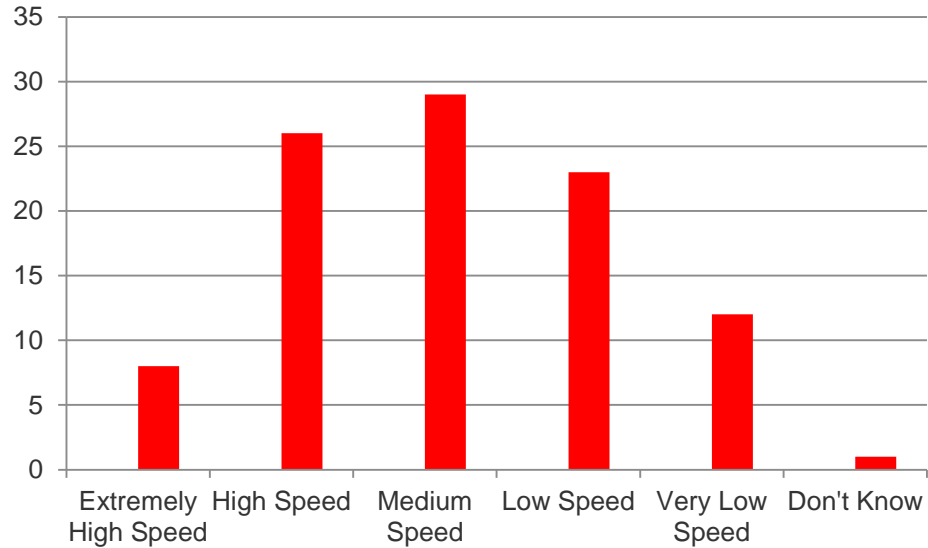
What is the population of your jurisdiction?



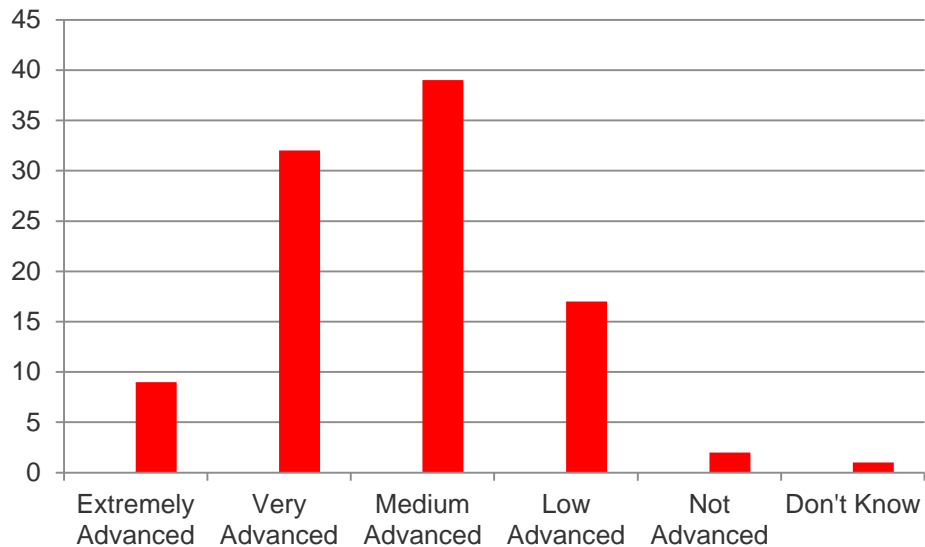
How important is broadband to the future economic prosperity and quality of life in your jurisdiction?



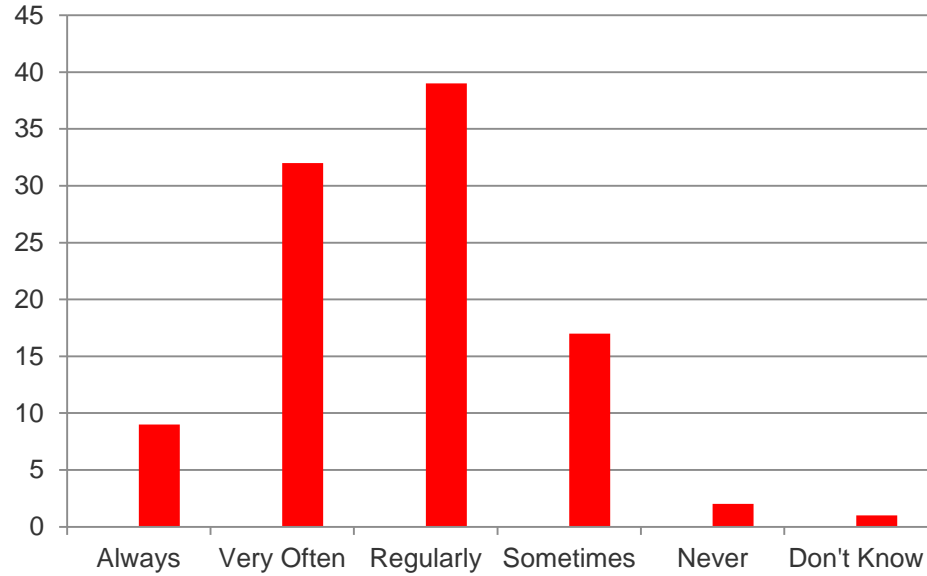
How would you rate the availability and quality (speed and reliability) of broadband in your jurisdiction?



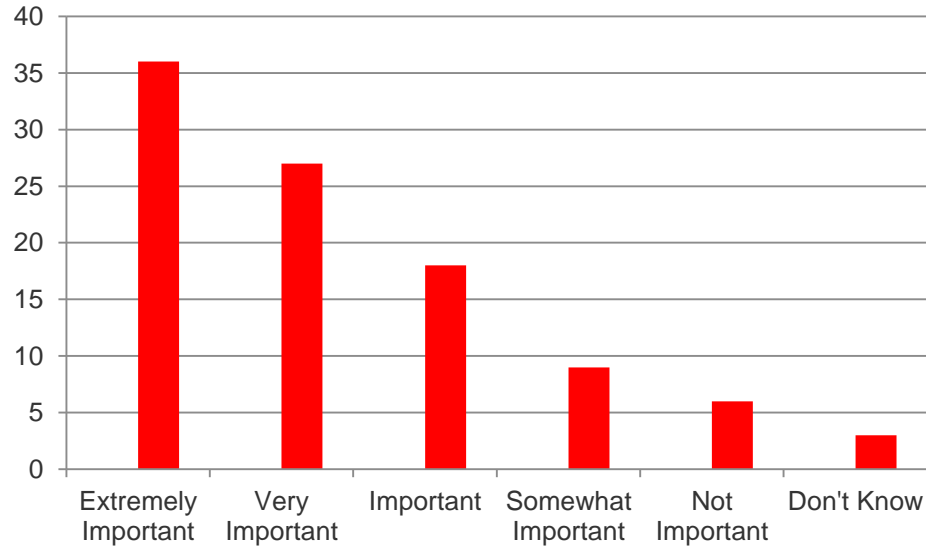
How technology advanced or “smart” is your jurisdiction in providing information and services online?



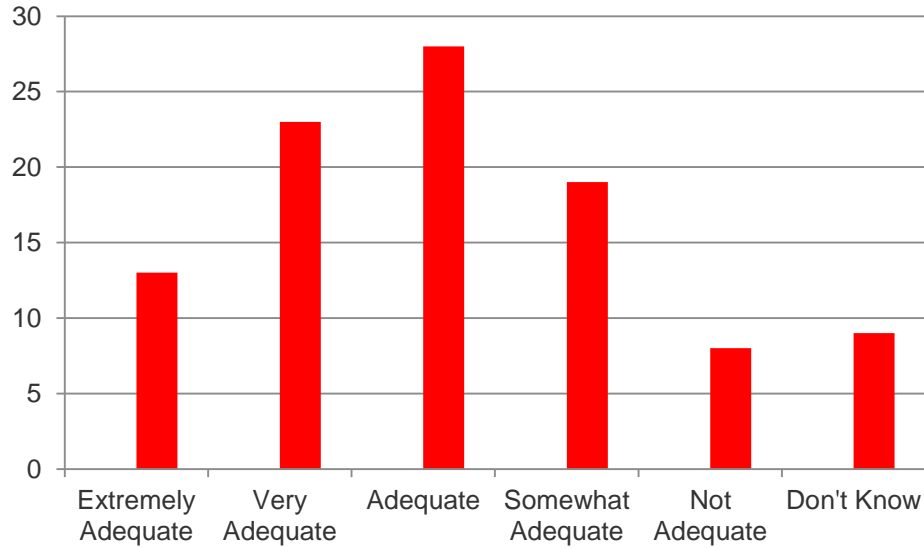
To what extent does your jurisdiction use electronic communications to reach its residents?



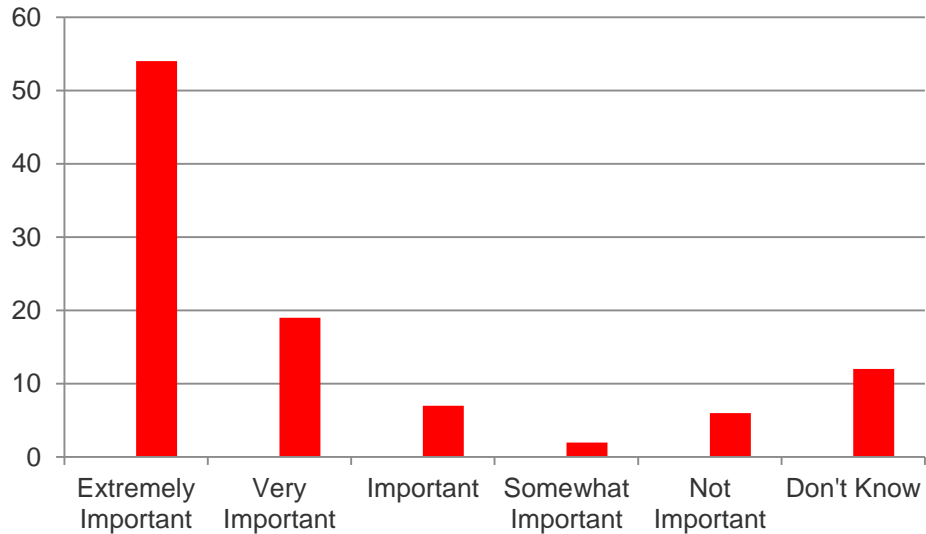
How important is broadband as an issue to your residents based on comments or complaints you have received?



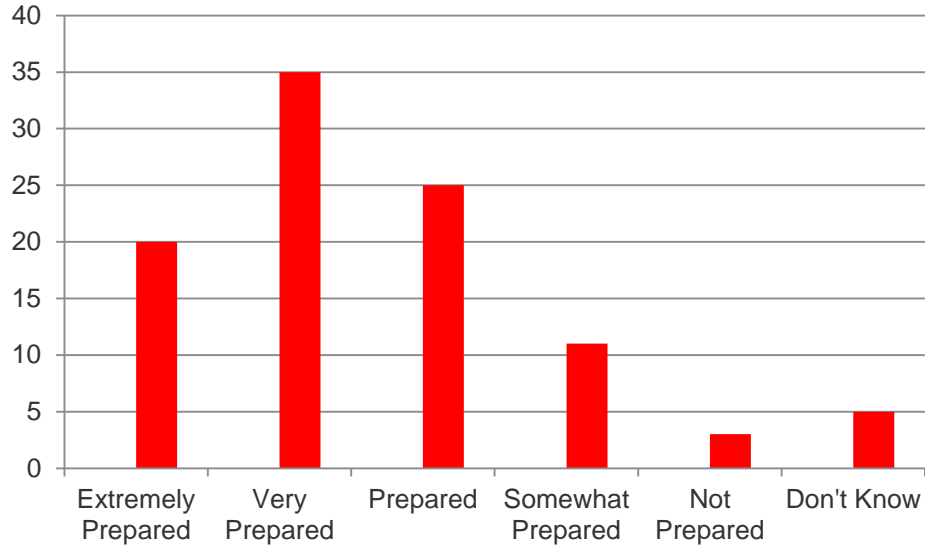
What is the adequacy of broadband in your jurisdiction for public safety and emergency responses?



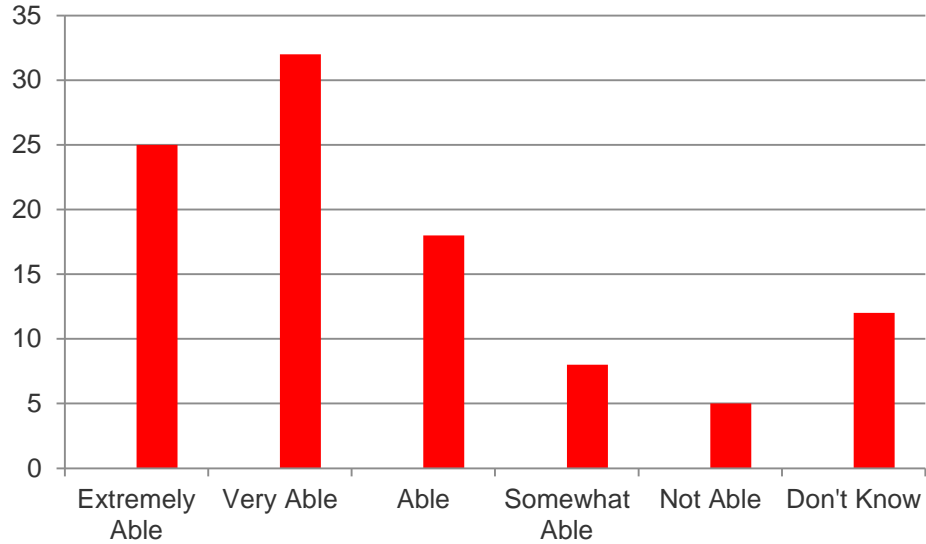
How important is broadband to the smaller businesses and large employers in your jurisdiction?



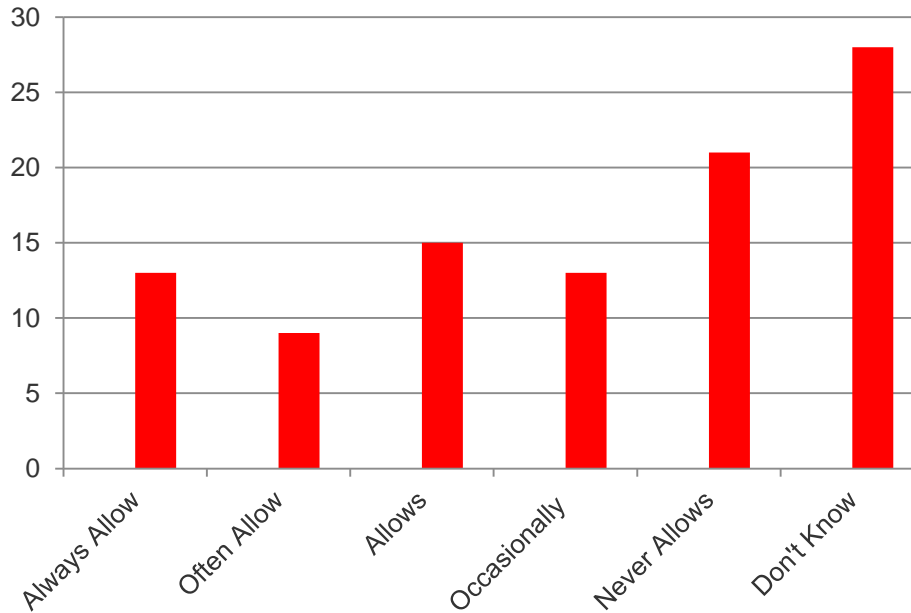
How prepared is your workforce to use computing and Internet navigation skills to fill available jobs?



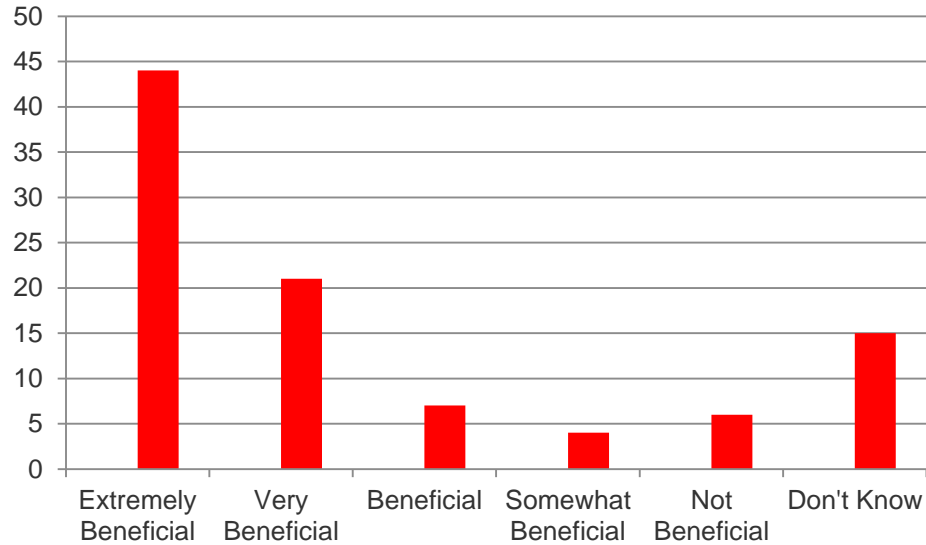
To what extent are your schools able to provide students with computing devices and broadband in classrooms?
