# Become a SafePet Foster Parent

Many survivors of intimate partner violence will not leave their abuser if they cannot take their pet(s) with them to safety. The SafePet program removes a significant barrier for those fleeing abuse by caring for their pet(s) until the survivor is stabilized and safe. For survivors who are unable to find a trusted family member, friend, or co-worker, to care for their pet(s), SafePet can literally save lives.

## How does the program work?





- The SafePet Program is administered by the Ontario Veterinary Medical Association.
- Our confidential SafePet veterinarians provide assistance by serving as a neutral, secret location where the pet owner can drop-off her/his pet when leaving their abuser.
- The veterinarian completes a health and behavioural exam of the pet and administers any needed vaccinations. The identities of the pet's owner and of the SafePet foster parent are kept strictly confidential for the security and well-being of all involved.
- Our pet foster parent picks the animal up from the confidential vet clinic and cares for the pet for up to one year.
- Once the survivor is re-established in a safe environment, she/he is reunited with her/his pet(s).
