

Institute for the Family will host a forum with African CFM Presidents from Malawi, Margaret and Michael Moyo, and their Chaplain Fr. Mtseka and other Catholic leaders on July 6 at the Josephite Seminary in Washington, DC. The Forum topic is "Inviting Leaders of Family Networks, Alliances and Organizations Globally to New Spiritual Vision." There will also be a tour of the Shrine of the Immaculate Conception and the Franciscan Monastery. Local CFMers are invited to attend. Lauri and John Przybysz will host the group in their home. The Moyos and Fr. Mtseka will then travel to Mexico to attend the ICCFM World Assembly.
