CFM is Growing!

Three parishes in Oshkosh, Wisconsin, St. Jude, Blessed Sacrament and St. Raphael, introduced CFM to their parishioners this fall. Fr. Louis Golamari, CFM National Chaplain, and a pastor in Oshkosh, along with his staff, promoted CFM there. In August, Christian Family Movement USA Presidents, Brian and Mary Ann Thelen, traveled to Oshkosh to help spread the good news.

At the dinner and presentation that evening 180 people enjoyed hearing how the Christian Family Movement strengthens marriage and family, builds community within the parish and gives people a safe place to discuss big topics affecting our families and our society.

Some of the comments following the presentation were that they liked the idea that the discussions were followed by actions and that accountability is what creates real change. Fr. Louis spoke briefly after the presentation inviting parishioners to join one of the new action groups.

The new Oshkosh groups will use *Meeting Jesus Changes Everything*, the first of the three-part CFM Discipleship Formation series. Deacon Jerry and Ronnie Brennan, national CFM board members, later conducted a training for the parishioners who will be leading the groups.
