ICCFM Advent Prayer Gathering Models a Synodal Church


A synodal Church, in announcing the Gospel, 'journeys together.' The Church is asking, "How is this 'journeying together' happening today in your local Church? What steps does the Spirit invite us to take in order to grow in our journeying together?"

Leaders of CFM from around the world engaged in a "synodal process" by Zoom on November 26, giving each continent a chance to share their experiences, pray, and listen to one another. ICCFM leadership welcomed 34 participants from Philippines, Mexico,



Thailand, Spain, Canada, India, Hungary, Malawi, Sri Lanka, Panama, Honduras, Guatemala, USA. Presidents Brian and Mary Ann Thelen and board members John and Lauri Przybyszs represented CFM-USA.
