23	Sec. 2. Establishment of the Commission on Climate Change and Resilier	icy.
24	(a) There is established a Commission on Climate Change and Resiliency	
25	25 ("Commission") to assess the impacts of the changing climate and potential impa	icts of

77	(2) Conduct vulnerability assessments for the current resilience of critical	
78	infrastructure and systems, including energy production, food and water security, the built	
79	environment, natural resources, emergency preparedness and response, transportation,	
80	housing, economic risk management, and public health;	
81	(3) Develop goals to address vulnerabilities and increase resiliency;	

82	(4) Evaluate the expected impacts of climate change on critical infrastructure	
83	and systems, natural resources, public health, and economy; and

107 (b) The Chairperson of the Commission, or his or her designee from among the 108 members of the Commission, shall convene all Commission meetings. 109 (c) A majority of the voting members appointed to the Commission at any given time 110 shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of official business. Official actions of the Commission shall be taken by majority vote of the voting members present at the meeting. 111 (d) The Commission may use space and supplies owned or rented by the 112 District government and use staff detailed by the Mayor for purposes consistent with this 113 act as the Commission may determine. 114 115 (e) The Commission may form workgroups to consider specific subtopics, and may invite outside participation, including the public and subject matter experts. 116 Sec. 5. Commission on Climate Change and Resiliency Fund. 117 (a) There is established as a special fund the Climate Change and Resiliency Fund 118 ("Fund"), which shall be administered by the Department of the Environment on behalf of 119 the Commission in accordance with subsection (c) of this section. 120 (b) Revenue from the following sources shall be deposited into the Fund: 121 122 (1) Appropriations; 123 (2) Private gifts or donations; and 124 (3) Federal grants, when awarded. 125 (c) Money in the Fund shall be used to fulfill the functions and duties of the Commission, as set forth in section 3. 126 (d)(1) The money deposited into the Fund, and interest earned, shall not revert to 127 the unrestricted fund balance of the General Fund of the District of Columbia at the end of 128

131	funds appropriated in the Fund shall be continually available without regard to fiscal year
