
Goldston Old Fashion Days

Redistricting

As this newsletter goes to print, redistricting for the North Carolina House of Representatives, NC Senate, and US Representative districts are being shuffled pursuant to lawsuits by the Democrat party. How will it end up? No one knows at the point. The only guarantee is that there will be more lawsuits before it is all over. Stay tuned. Here is the current proposed US Representative district map. Under this version Chatham is split into two districts, the 4th and 13th.



Primary Elections

Primary Elections will be on March 3, 2020. Remember the Primaries are where we select who we want to see on the General Election ballot in November 2020.

Candidates wishing to be on the March ballot must file between noon on December 2 and noon on December 20.

You must be registered to vote by February 7, 2019 for the March 3 Primary Election Day. Unsure if you are registered? Check out your registration status at this link: [Voter Search](#). If you have moved, you must update your registration status. One way to do that is to visit the Chatham County Board of Elections office at 984 Thompson Street, Suite D, Pittsboro NC 27312.

- You can register to vote in North Carolina if
 - You are at least 16 years old, and
 - You are a US Citizen, and
 - You have lived in North Carolina for at least 30 days prior to Election Day, and
 - You are not currently serving a felony sentence and you are not currently on probation or parole for a felony conviction.
- You can then VOTE if you are registered to vote *and* are 18 years old or older by or on Election Day. 17-year-olds can vote in the Primary election *only* if they will be 18 on General Election Day.

Voter ID. Remember, you will need a photo identification to vote in the March 2020 primaries. We will provide more information on that in our December newsletter.

TAXES! In addition to candidates, the Chatham County Commissioners have placed a **sales tax referendum** on the March primary ballot. If you think you pay enough in taxes, you **must** make sure you vote in the March election and make your voice heard. The Commissioners want more tax money: how they spend it us completely up to them once they get it.
