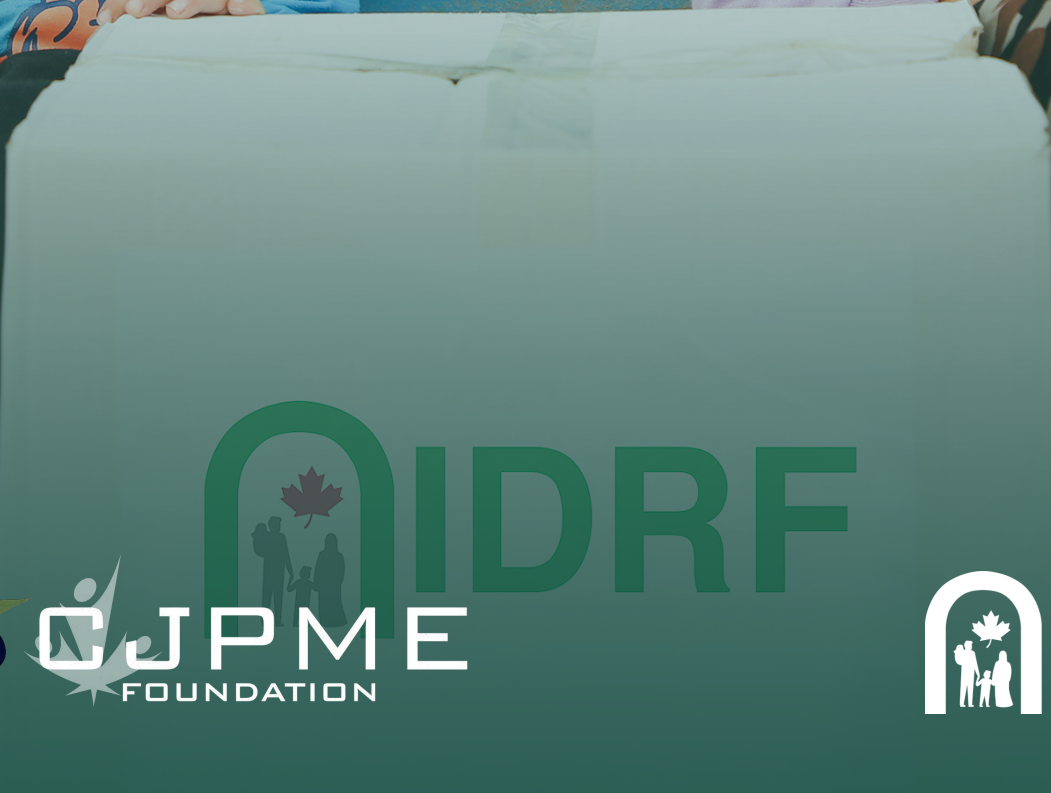

Between May 10 - 21, 2021, the world witnessed a new Israeli military assault on Gaza. According to the Office of the High Commissioner for Human Rights (OHCHR), as of May 27, 2021, 256 Palestinians, including 66 children and 40 women, were killed.

Almost 2,000 Palestinians were injured during the hostilities, including over 600 children and 400 women, some of whom sustained severe injuries and may suffer from long-term disabilities, requiring rehabilitation.

With the continued escalation, the needs for healthcare, medicines, medical consumables, and emergency food parcel delivery increased. The bombardments lead to the displacement of nearly half a million Palestinians within Gaza and exacerbated the already fragile health system.







# Our Response

In May, with the support of the CJPME Foundation, IDRF was able to launch a swift and effective emergency response in Gaza. Based on information from our local team, the urgent needs were identified as food and nutrition, and medical support for hospitals and clinics.

Medical equipment, medicines, and consumable materials were delivered and used in the Hayfa Medical Hospital, supporting thousands of patients needing emergency surgeries from across Gaza and thousands of COVID-19 patients residing within the hospitals.

The impact of this project expands beyond numbers.

Ramez Al-Masri, a 54-year-old father of nine children that live in North Gaza, had lost his home once in the 2014 bombings, and then again in May 2021. Ramez states, “I live in an area in Gaza that is high in unemployment and poverty. We had the highest outbreak during COVID”, he continues “I could not provide food for my family for the longest time.”

Ali Hajjaj, a 38-year-old father of five children living in East Gaza was working as a First Aid worker and an ambulance driver during the bombardments in May. He was one of the rescue teams that removed rubble and rescued people trapped under collapsed buildings.

He stated, “As a first responder, all I could do was transport the people we rescue to hospitals, which are then supported by the medical equipment received.” He continues, “I don’t think I would have been mentally strong enough to know that the children I saved were going to the hospital to die due to the lack of medicines.”
