MANAGER'S CORNER — "State of the Association"

It's been a year since I first came on board with Clear Lake City Community Association, and my how it has flown by. It's been a busy, busy year! As most of you are aware, we have made quite few changes here at CLCCA.

There are a lot of fresh faces in our office and around the facilities. The facilities have received much needed attention and refurbishment. In my first year as General Manager, we have:

- Increased pool maintenance to a year round schedule "bye, bye green pools!"
- Painted the interior of the entire Diana Campus with sponsorship funds (special thanks to Amoco Federal Credit Union).
- Brought all play structures and fall surfaces up to code.
- Worked on safety/code issues at all pools.
- Replaced a lot of failing mechanical equipment with more reliable and energy efficient equipment.
- Installed 2 new playground structures at Meadowgreen and Oakbrook West Parks.
- Began a series of Town Hall meetings to educate residents on what CLCCA is currently working on and to solicit feedback from residents.
- Began a door to door campaign with flyers and advertising.
- Solicited community feedback through a survey distributed online and door to door.
- Updated our website and created an email blast system to help increase communication.
- Revamped our facility usage pricing and developed our "Medallion Plan."
- Added additional events such as: Dive In Movies, Spring Fling, Fall Festival, Parents Night Out, etc.
- Added additional fitness classes including: Zumba, Kickboxing, additional Water Fitness Classes, and Year Round Swim Lessons.
- Began to clean up park and common area landscaping with extensive tree pruning.
- Applied for and received a grant from the City of Houston to assist in funding of the project to repair the Camino South sign at Thunderbay and El Dorado.
- Applied for and received our license from the State of Texas to operate a Camp Program.

This next year you will begin to see even more changes and improvements. My staff is committed to being budget minded while improving the level of service the residents receive. Thank you for your patience over the past year while we work through some of the "hiccups." I hope that the upcoming year will continue to see improvements in communication and maintenance. I have said many times that I expected it to take about 18 months to achieve the level of maintenance and service I would like to see, and we are on track to achieve this goal. CURBSIDE RECYCLING

The Oakbrook subdivision is participating in the City of Houston pilot automated curbside recycling and placed second in a contest to see which neighborhood had the most participation in the City of Houston's curbside recycling program. Way to go, Oakbrook! Their efforts may help all of us get curbside recycling. For now, though, the rest of us must deliver our own recyclables to Ellington or a school/library paper collection container. Many people have asked what to do in Camino South, Oakbrook West, and Meadowgreen to get curbside recycling.

We need to request curbside recycling and when resources become available, neighborhoods that have shown enough support for the program should get it. To request curbside recycling, simply write a letter to the City of Houston Solid Waste Department and ask for your subdivision to be considered for curbside recycling. Be sure to provide:

- the subdivision name and garbage service day,
- the name, address, and phone number of a contact person (you), and
- a note that you are next to the Oakbrook subdivision which already has automated curbside recycling.

2010 POOL SEASON

The 2009 Summer Pool Season is quickly approaching! The Oakbrook West pool will be available throughout the pool season for pool parties, swim meets, and other rental activities (call Shelly at 281-488-0360 to make reservations). The Outdoor Recreation Pool will be open on weekends from 12:00 pm - 8:00 pm starting on Memorial Day weekend, May 29th-31st. The Camino South and Meadowgreen pools will open following a rotating schedule on Monday, June 7th. The schedule for June and July will be as follows:

- Outdoor Recreation Center Pool will be open from 12:00 pm 8:00 pm, seven days a week.
- Camino South Pool will be open from 2:00 pm 7:00 pm on Tuesdays, Thursdays, and Fridays, and from 12:00 pm 8:00 pm on Saturdays and Sundays.
- Meadowgreen Pool will be open from 2:00 pm 7:00 pm on Wednesdays, Thursdays, and Fridays, and from 12:00 pm 8:00 pm on Saturdays and Sundays.

Beginning in August, the Camino South and Meadowgreen pools will be open following the same rotating schedule from 4:00 pm - 7:00 pm. The Outdoor Recreation Center Pool will continue to be open from 12:00 pm - 8:00 pm seven days a week. All pools will close after the Labor Day Weekend.

We have now presented three Community Spirit Awards to members of our community:







YARD WASTE AND THE NEW CITY BAGS

By now we all know about the largely unpopular new city ordinance, effective April 5, 2010, to use only expensive, city approved biodegradable bags for our yard waste.

Two simple solutions: DON'T BAG IT! Or COMPOST IT!

DON'T BAG IT! Why spend time and effort putting grass clippings into bags, when left on the lawn they provide valuable nutrients to the soil? The Texas A&M Agricultural Extension Service has developed the "Don't Bag It" Lawn Care Plan.

Here's how it works:

- 1. You can use a standard mower without a bagging attachment, a mulching mower, or a kit to convert your standard mower.
- 2. Adjust the height of your mower to leave your lawn 2-4" high. Cut with a sharp blade every 5-7 days during the growing season.
- 3. Remove no more than 1/3 of the leaf blade.
- 4. Let your clippings fall to the ground as you mow.
- 5. Mow only when the lawn is dry to prevent the clippings from landing in clumps.
- 6. If your yard is professionally managed, ask your lawn service to leave the grass clippings on the lawn instead of bagging them.

Benefits:

- 1. Avoids thatch. Thatch is an accumulation of roots and stems on the surface of the soil caused by over fertilizing and incorrect watering. Finely cut grass clippings are 85-90% moisture. They break down very easily and do not cause thatch.
- 2. Promotes a healthier lawn which is more bug and weed-resistant.
- 3. Saves time and money on bagging.

COMPOST IT! Recycling organic waste produced in our consumption of goods is the process we call composting. By Composting, valuable organic material is returned to soil. Composting in the participation in Nature's Cycle, and also reduces the amount of garbage that is sent to landfills.

What to Compost:

- Yard Trimmings (plants / flowers / small tree waste)
- Leaves
- Grass Clippings
- Vegetable and Fruit scraps
- Tea Leaves
- Wood Chips
- Paper-shredded newspaper and white paper. (No ink or dyes)

What to Avoid (with your backyard Compost)

- Meats, Fish, Poultry
- Food Sauces
- Fats, Grease, Oils
- Feces
- Invasive Weeds
- Treated Wood
- Ashes and Charcoal
- Non-Organic Materials (Plastics / Metals / Glass)
- Placing on Utility easements

Benefits:

- 1. Reduces waste
- 2. Promotes healthy soil
- 3. Reduces water & fertilizer usage
- 4. Reduces erosion, runoff, and pollution
