

Tracking tools:

- (1) ePlanning land-use planning and implementation decisions
- (2) Federal Register agency rulemaking, notices
- (3) Other (mailing lists, news releases, etc.)

ePlanning - http://eplanning.blm.gov/


- Online portal that provides public access to BLM land-use planning and NEPA documents, including:
 - Resource Management Plans and Amendments
 - Environmental Impacts Statements (EIS)
 - Environmental Assessments (EA)
 - Determinations of NEPA Adequacy (DNA)
 - Categorical Exclusions (Cx)
- Each project has its own page, where you can find draft decisions, supporting documents, public comments, etc.
- Find active projects by a map- or text-based search.



2. The Federal Register – www.federalregister.gov

- What is the Federal Register?
 - The official "newspaper" of the federal government
 - Published every business day
- What's in the Federal Register?
 - Presidential documents

 (i.e., Executive Orders and Proclamations)
 - Final agency rules and regulations
 - Proposed agency rules and regulations
 - Agency notices
- Overlap with ePlanning:
 - YES: land-use planning
 - NO: implementation-level decisions (i.e. NEPA documents)



2. The Federal Register – www.federalregister.gov

- Ways to use the Federal Register to track agency decisions:
 - **Search the archives** search past issues based on issuing agency, date, document category, etc.
 - Curated lists browse the daily list of entries on environmental issues.
 - https://www.federalregister.gov/environment
 - **Email Notifications** sign up to receive a daily email with any entries meeting particular search results
 - Look for the "subscribe" box on federalregister.gov

3. Other tracking methods

- BLM mailing lists
 - Want to be notified of all upcoming projects? Call your local field office to request placement on their mailing list
 - Want to track a specific project? Check the agency notice document (e.g. "Notice of Intent") for instructions on being added to the project mailing list
- Become a member of the "interested public"
 - Applicable only to grazing decisions. See 43 CFR 4160.1

BLM TO HOST PUBLIC SCOPING MEETINGS FOR NEW MONUMENT PLANS

SALT LAKE CITY — The Bureau of Land Management (BLM) will host four public scoping meetings as par of the ongoing land use planning for Bears Ears National Monument (BENM) and Grand Staircase-Escalante National Monument (GSENM). Scoping efforts were initiated Jan. 16, 2018, for the BENM - Indian Creek and Shash Jáa units; the GSENM- Grand Staircase, Kaiparowits, and Escalante Canyon units and federal lands previously included in the GSENM that are now excluded from its boundaries. In total, the BLM will produce six land use plans and two associated Environmental Impact Statements (EIS). The BLM and U.S. Forest Service will jointly prepare the land use plan and associated EIS for the Shash Jáa
