Presidential Election


AZ (11) — Biden +0.3 (flip)

NV (6) — Biden +2



Total popular vote in those 12 states:


Biden 20.4M, Trump 14.5M



- ✓ Democratic president pledging unity and bipartisanship

- ✓ Closely-divided Senate led by Republicans

- ✓ Identify bipartisan, bicameral legislative conservation opportunities like the Dingell Act and Great American Outdoors Act.
- ✓ Work with Biden administration to take bold action, reform Interior and Bureau of Land Management.



Forward Motion in Divided Government

Community-based power sets the stage for success:

- ✓ Friends Grassroots Network is perfectly positioned to work in this political environment to protect more landscapes:
 - Protecting 30% of America's lands and waters by 2030.
 - Place-based campaigns with clear public support.
- ✓ Expanding the diversity of conservation experiences and voices to improve public health, promote environmental justice, and honor ancestral connections of Native Americans.
- ✓ Bridging partisan divides to find common ground as was done in Oregon's Malheur County.

First 100 Days:

- ✓ Restore Bears Ears and Grand Staircase-Escalante National Monuments
- ✓ Implement Federal 30x30 Strategy
- ✓ Freeze and begin reversing bad management plans
- ✓ Advance Stewardship and Stimulus economic recovery legislation

Long Game:

- ✓ Bureau of Land Management reform
- ✓ Advancing Place-Based Campaigns
