



Canada Mathare Education Trust 2010-2011 Annual Report (May 2010 – May 2011)

2010/2011 marked the 5th anniversary of CMETrust and celebrations were held in both Canada and Kenya. 2010/11 was another year of growth and development for CMETrust as an organization and for our Board, volunteers and scholarship beneficiaries. We celebrated the gradation of five more scholars, bringing the Trust's total number of graduates to 13, and especially the accomplishments of Samson Omondi who achieved Direct Entry¹ to university in Kenya – Congratulations, Samson! To respond to the growth of the CMETrust alumni and their general wish to enter into post-secondary programs, a Post-Secondary Scholarship Committee was established to coordinate the piloting of 2-3 CMETrust post-secondary scholarships in 2011/12.

In the past year, CMETrust was able to generate important media coverage of the return of our President (Victoria Sheppard) to Mathare for the first time in three years. The organizational and operational linkages between Canada and Kenya were also further strengthened and renewed during this field visit.

We have added an excellent new member to our Board of Trustees and a number of experienced volunteers to our chapters. Great work has been accomplished on our web renewal exercise, and we are on target to launch the new CMETrust.org on Canada Day (July 1st). Kenyan Field Liaison Officer, Charles O. Onyango, considers the even greater self-motivation witnessed this year in CMETrust scholarship recipients, Alumni, Kenyan Agents and Board members, to be a very great success. It is with all these accomplishments in mind, that we reflect back on the year and look forward to 2011/12.

¹ Direct Entry is awarded to Kenyan high school graduates who achieve high enough marks in their Kenyan Certificate of Secondary Education exam to be eligible for a government loan to support their post-secondary studies. Achieving Direct Entry is considered to be quite a prestigious accomplishment.

1. PRESIDENT'S REPORT

Where we've been:

- CMETrust Board members establish goals for 2010/11 at our 2010 Annual General Meeting (AGM) in May, facilitated by Sarah Lawson for the third year.
- Submission of CMETrust's 2009 Charities Act Information Return to Revenue Canada.
- The 2009/10 CMETrust Annual Report published on the CMETrust website.
- The *CMETrust News* Volume 6 published in July 2010 & Volume 7 published in December 2010
- CMETrust-UOttawa committee President and member of the CMETrust-Ottawa chapter executive, Leah Stuart-Sheppard, visited Mathare in August 2010.
- In August 2010, CMETrust scholars participated in school break activities, including: a General Meeting, a Mathare Clean-Up, a Mathare in Focus photography meeting, a Reproductive Health workshop, and a "Giving Back" workshop (hosted by Leah Stuart-Sheppard).
- CMETrust Post-Secondary Scholarship Committee officially established, to research funding possibilities for post-secondary scholarship support and to coordinate the piloting of a CMETrust post-secondary scholarship program in 2011/12.
- Successful requests for funding from the Leaside (\$1,200) and Toronto-Eglinton (\$2,400) Rotary clubs.
- Five CMETrust scholars sat the Kenyan Certificate of Secondary Education (KCSE) exams in November and passed. One of these scholars, Samson Omondi, achieved high enough marks to receive Direct Entry to University in 2011, a first for CMETrust. This brings the total number of CMETrust graduates to 13.
- In December 2010, CMETrust scholars participated in school break activities, including: a General Meeting, a Human Rights workshop, Tree Planting in Mathare, Team Building exercises; as well as a meeting with the scholars' parents and guardians.
- In December 2010, CMETrust President and Kenyan Liaison Officer (Charles Onyango) travelled to Kenya for 5 weeks. Activities including: holding a 3-day retreat with CMETrust Kenyan Agents; travelling "upcountry" to visit one of the secondary boarding schools; meeting with the CMETrust alumni; meeting with the CMETrust scholars' parents & guardians; hosting McGill University's Canadian Field Studies in Africa program; meeting with partner organizations on the ground; meeting

with potential funders; taking photographs and making “video diaries” to help promote CMETrust online (www.YouTube.com/CMETrust); looking into registration of CMETrust as a Community Based Organization (CBO) in Kenya; celebrating CMETrust 5th anniversary with the CMETrust “family” in Nairobi.

- In January 2011, CBC’s Carolyn Dunn produced a story on CMETrust for The National (television), the World This Weekend (radio) and CBC News (online – <http://www.cbc.ca/news/world/story/2011/01/23/f-kenya-mathare-slum.html>).
- Article by Stephanie Vizi published in Carleton University’s paper, the Charlatan (<http://www.charlatan.ca/content/beggars-can-be-choosers>).
- CMETrust-Ottawa executive member, Karen Sutherland, visited Mathare in March 2011.
- In April 2011, CMETrust scholars participated in school break activities, including: a General Meeting, an Entrepreneurship workshop, our annual Mathare in Focus Photography workshop, Team Building exercises, and a Mathare Clean-Up.
- CMETrust Kenyan Agents travelled “upcountry” twice during the year, to meet with the administration at the secondary boarding schools that CMETrust scholars attend.
- The CMETrust is currently supporting 45 scholars from Mathare in secondary boarding school; 31 returning scholars and 14 new scholarship recipients. 16 of our scholars are in Form 4 this year and therefore set to write their KCSE exams in November.
- CMETrust welcomes new Board member, Kathie Oginsky, CMETrust-Ottawa co-chair and Ottawa chapter representative to the Board. The new Board position of Mathare in Focus Coordinator was confirmed at the 2011 AGM, filled by Consuelo van Beek.

Challenges/Lessons Learned:

- The CMETrust Board of Trustees continues to weigh the benefits and costs associated with incorporating. At this time, CMETrust remains unincorporated but discussions are ongoing.
- CMETrust was issued a ticket by the City of Montreal for a poster with our logo on it apparently being put up in a restricted area (on a streetlight pole). While CMETrust appealed and the case was dismissed, it did provide an important lesson-learned with respect to ensuring anyone putting on a fundraising event for CMETrust is familiar with the postering by-laws for their particular city.
- CMETrust sees some benefit in registering as a CBO in Kenya (e.g., access to currently unavailable funding). We are currently consulting with a charities lawyer in

Canada to make sure that doing so will be in accordance with the rules governing charities under Canada's *Income Tax Act*.

- As CMETrust celebrates the graduation of its scholars, with another 16 scholars possibly graduating at the end of 2011, we recognize the importance of carefully considering the results of the post-secondary pilot project and how they should shape the future direction of our organization.

Where we're going.....

- Establishment of a Mathare in Focus Committee to work towards our medium-term goal of generating a higher percentage of CMETrust revenue through sales of our *Mathare in Focus* calendar and photographs, in Canada and Kenya.
- Production of our third annual CMETrust *Mathare in Focus* calendar and increase sales in Ottawa, Toronto and Kitchener-Waterloo
- Continuation of the Mathare in Focus tour around Ottawa, and expansion to Toronto and Kitchener-Waterloo
- Production and dissemination of the *CMETrust News* Volumes 8 (spring) & 9 (fall)
- Continue development of relationships with Rotary clubs in Toronto, Kitchener-Waterloo and Ottawa
- Launching the new CMETrust.org
- Further development of a Board of Trustees binder; to be posted on the CMETrust Wiki (the Wiki is currently being piloted by the CMETrust-Ottawa chapter)
- Continue to reach out and build partnerships with high schools in Canada, and the piloting of our Student Leader Action Kits in Toronto and Ottawa schools
- CMETrust Board site visit to Kenya in 2011/12
- Aeroplan appeal to collect Miles to support our Kenyan Agents visit to Canada for our 2012 AGM and spring events
- Piloting of 2-3 post-secondary scholarships in 2012
- Develop a Financial Plan for CMETrust
- Source funds to support the professional development of CMETrust Kenyan Agents
- Develop a CMETrust Fundraising Policy

- Develop written agreements (e.g., MOUs) with partner organizations in Canada and Kenya
- Increase CMETrust's Social Media presence

2. KENYAN AGENTS REPORT

Aluta Continua

I bumped on to an old friend the other day and it was actually a very interesting meeting. The last time I saw her was about five years ago when she was finishing her studies to become a social worker. She was on her field trip to Kenya and she was always interested in helping people, especially the needy ones. Then I was finishing on my Neo-Media Design and Development Course, which eventually led to a job. Shortly after she left back to her homeland, we lost contact and life went on.

Fast forward to the day of the meet-up, we exchanged pleasantries and after that we went on to catch up with what has been happening on both sides of our lives. "And how about you Tito?" she asked. For a minute I was a bit lost for words. This is due to the fact that looking back 1,830 days it's not easy to recall everything in a split second. All the same, I went on to tell a summary of my story. But the part she really got interested in was the CMETrust part. Why? One would ask. Simply because just before she left to her country, my best friend and I had strongly hinted to her that our biggest dream was to establish a foundation that can cater for the high school education of bright but needy students from Mathare Slums and its environments. That time she thought that the idea was good but she felt that it would not be foreseeable in the next 10 years. She had a lot of facts; we didn't have enough money, expertise, resources, etc., to run a foundation. She actually made a lot of sense then and my friend and I listened to her but we were defiant and strongly reiterated that we had to accomplish our goal one way or the other no matter how long or what it would take. Those last days' conversations didn't always end up nicely as we were always on the opposite sides whenever this topic came up.

I finished the summary by telling her that CMETrust actually celebrated our 5th year anniversary recently and even though it wasn't the biggest celebration in terms of pomp and colour, it was actually one of my most surreal days - in attendance; my best friend, Charles, our president, Victoria, the students, family and friends. Wow! Just amazing! Very few moments in time come closer to that feeling. She could hardly believe that a dream could come true that quickly. She wondered how we could do it that fast and swiftly. I was very quick to let her know that we have been very fortunate to have friends who had in their hearts to believe in our thoughts and consequently spread the same message to their acquaintances and their loved ones. That is how CMETrust has managed to survive for the last 5 years or so I believe.

My good old friend patted me on the back and wished me and the CMETrust family good luck. Her cab had arrived and she was rushing to meet her boss in a Five Star hotel in town. Two weeks later, she called me from Netherlands and she mentioned to me that she was sending applications to apply for anything that comes close to her old job. She felt that despite earning a good salary, endless travels to exotic destinations and having influential contacts, her calling in life was always helping people around her to be better and happier. She felt that she had not lived a fulfilling but an 'ok' life and it's time she made the big u-turn.

I am not so sure each one of us can remember vividly what they were doing five years ago. I am also not so confident in saying that some of us are probably living their dreams as we speak. I am also not definite that some of us are enjoying what they are doing or the life they are living at the

moment. What I am sure is that CMETrust binds all of us. It makes a beautiful story that we can all proudly share with all and sundry around us. And that's why we need to finally hold our glasses up in the air and toast to the existence of CMETrust. Having said that the story continues and as they say; *Aluta Continua*.

Activities :

Our activities from the last five years or so have been diverse and vital in the development of the current students and the alumni. From strong team building activities in the park to eye-opening human rights awareness lecture, from intriguing sex information forum to informative career choice session, from eco-friendly tree planting program to giving back to the community clean-ups, from the very successful photography workshop to marking a very big milestone with a big anniversary bash, it has been a long year but a very successful one. Achievements :

Today, we would like to proudly say that being around for the last five years could be the biggest achievement so far. Sticking together as a team regardless of our backgrounds or cultural differences could also be counted as a very big achievement as well.

Challenges :

We actually enjoy being part of this wonderful family. Unfortunately, at times we encounter some situations that leave us confused on how to handle them. We have a wealth of practical experience acquired over the years through a couple of initiatives that Benedict and I have been involved in but we still need to be better equipped in terms of theoretical understanding of the same situations.

We also need to learn how to do things in a better, swifter way. This we feel can be achieved in many ways - courses, workshops and seminars being good avenues to do this. Unfortunately, most of this empowerment options are costly and mostly beyond the reach of many ordinary people. This will not only help the agents but the whole organization as a whole.

Goals:

This year we aim to fulfill the strategic plan we just developed in January, 2011. We also hope to have strong and independent alumni that can come up with their own initiatives. The other objective is to ensure that there is better communication between the board and the agents.

This will enable the trust to grow and provide more opportunities for children in Mathare. We also hope that we will achieve our set goals by consulting the concerned authorities and coming up with concrete outcomes.

4. TORONTO CHAPTER REPORT

Our Achievements this year:

- The 5th Annual Hearts for Smarts, CMETrust's flagship event, was held at the Peridot Resto Lounger in Toronto on March 3, 2011. The event raised \$8272.
- The Toronto chapter has a strong volunteer committee, making for well-appointed subcommittees to be formed for the various initiatives of the chapter
- Members of the CMETrust Toronto chapter worked with The Girl Guides of Canada Unit administrator, Debbie Williamson, to facilitate presentations with local girl guide groups, with the purpose of raising awareness about urban poverty and education in Kenya, and to encourage Girl Guides to generate funding through their organization.
- CMETrust Board and Toronto chapter members have been generating education kits that can be implemented in secondary school classrooms.

Where we are going:

- The Toronto Chapter is planning to host a comedy show, which will benefit CMETrust in the fall of 2011.
- The Toronto Chapter is aiming to diversify its fundraising events in the upcoming year, in order to reach a more diverse group of supporters.
- Toronto will hold a Mathare in Focus Exhibit in connected with the Mathare in Focus calendar project.
- The Toronto Chapter plans to maintain its active and engaged volunteer base, with particular focus on support, mentorship, and further development of the current volunteer base.

5. KITCHENER-WATERLOO CHAPTER REPORT

Our Achievements this year:

- 'Cheers for Children II' was held on Friday, June 4, 2010 at the Victoria Park Pavilion in downtown Kitchener. The event raised \$5,453.
- 'Cheers for Children III' was held on April 4th, 2011, again at the Victoria Park Pavilion. The event raised \$8,006.
- A trivia night event held on December 13, 2010 raised \$600
- A garage sale event was held, with all proceed going to the CMETrust. The sale raised just over \$750.

Where we are going:

- The KW Chapter is looking forward to hosting 'Cheers for Children IV' for June 2012. The team is going to focus on garnering more media attention through local newspapers and magazines to shine a spotlight on the event.

- Work is underway to source spaces within the Kitchener-Waterloo area to sell the Mathare in Focus calendars in the fall.
- Due to the success of the first event, another garage sale will be held in Summer 2012.
- The KW team is interested to combine efforts with the CMETrust Toronto Chapter to host a charity golf tournament in 2012 or 2013.

6. OTTAWA CHAPTER REPORT

Our Achievements this Year:

- Through the 2009 Government of Canada Workplace Charitable Campaign (GCWCC), government employees pledged a total of \$3,635 to CMETrust through payroll deductions. These deductions were received in September 2010.
- 6 runners participated in the Ottawa Race Weekend in May 2010, raising an impressive total of \$2,645
- CMETrust-Ottwa collaborated with “Timekode” monthly dance party held at Eri Café, the Eritrean Cultural Centre. The event provided an opportunity to share information about CMETrust and to raise money, as \$1 from the cover charge was donated to CMETrust. The event raised \$525.
- CMETrust displayed the 2010 collection of Mathre in Focus photos at the Library and Achieves Canada in conjunction with the One World Film Festival. This was an outreach event.
- CMETrust was the beneficiary of a pumpkin carving contest held during Halloween season of 2010, which raised \$410.
- The second annual Mathare in Focus photo vernissage and launch of the Mathare in Focus Calendar, held in November 2010, was a sold out event, and raised \$6,736. The event was held at the Cube Gallery in Ottawa’s trendy Wellington Village. The evening featured an engaging presentation by Sol Guy, host of MTV’s “4Real”, complemented by performances by Canadian Spoken Word Champions “The Recipe” and by Ottawa Timekode dance party master, DJ Zattar spinning afrofunkreggae beats. The event also had a silent auction, merchandise table and plenty of food and drink.
- Mathare in Focus Calendar sales by volunteer in November and December 2010 raised \$2,603.
- Mathare in Focus photo prints were also available for sale outside of events, and raised \$320.
- 10 runners participated in the Ottawa Race Weekend in May 2011, raising \$3,964 for CMETrust.
- Guided through a series of meeting with CMETrust Ottawa volunteers in Kenya, CMETrust Alumni in Nairobi who have participated in the Mathare in Focus photography/calendar project have developed an organizational structure to run the calendar project as a small business in Kenya.
- CMETrust Ottawa participated in a pilot project implementing a CMETrust Wiki.
- The CMETrust’s University of Ottawa Chapter had a very busy and exciting year. The volunteer team aimed to put on 3-4 events per semester and reach to a broad array of students to raise money and provide information about the work of CMETrust in Kenya. Highlights include:

- Pizza night sales
- ‘Mingling for Mathare’; an awareness raising event featuring Kenyan food, music, trivia and a display of the Mathare in Focus photographs.
- A movie screening of *Pelada* in collaboration with Pelada film-makers, which raised \$250.
- ‘Sucker Run’, where volunteers sold suckers to students for donation.
- Bake sales

Where we are going:

- A Pub Quiz night fundraiser will be organized for September 2011
- CMETrust Ottawa chapter plans to participate in the Timekode monthly dance party at the Eritrean Culture Centre in October 2011
- The 2010 Mathare in Focus photographs will be displayed at the One World Film Festival in October 2011
- Mathare in Focus calendar launch and fundraiser will be held in November 2011
- Exploring the possibility of printing the Mathare in Focus calendars in Nairobi for local sales.
- CMETrust Ottawa plans to hold a winter concert in 2012

5. Revenue from Merchandise sales includes merchandise sales at fundraising events and public outreach events as well as the sale of Mathare in Focus calendars and photo prints.

7. Honorarium for Kenyan Agents totals \$2400, which is \$1200 for each agent paid in three instalments throughout the year.

9. Printing and Promotion includes DVD duplication, magnets, production of two pager, and other printing expenses.

10. Transportation costs are associated with CMETrust President travelling to meetings in Toronto and Montreal , as well as the costs associated with transporting the Mathare in Focus exhibit to display locations by taxi.

11. Interest and Bank charges include Monthly fees on our RBC account (\$3.75/month), other bank fees associated with transactions made above the limits set on our community account, and a \$45 fee every time we transfer funds to Kenya.

12. Office supplies and other expenses include stamps, envelopes, and printer ink.

13. Fundraising Expenditures are expenses associated with putting on major and minor fundraising events in various cities. Please note that some expenses related to fundraising events in 2010 were incurred in other years (eg. venue expenses for Mathare in Focus 2009 were paid for in 2010).

14. Merchandise expenses include purchase of merchandise, production of the Mathare in Focus Calendar, production of Mathare in Focus photo prints, framing and postage.

15. Other expenditures include: meeting expenses, membership fee to Volunteer Toronto, training, postage and petty cash.

16. The surplus is the amount of revenue minus expenses for the year.
