

## **DNC NEW YORK**

Pure primary delegate system

Important Dates:

- February 16, 2016: Filing deadline for district-level delegates
- April 19, 2016: Primary vote
- June 11, 2016: State Party Committee meeting

Number of Delegates:

- 152 District delegates
- 51 At-large delegates
- 30 Party leaders and elected officials
- 44 Super-delegates
- Total: 277

Process:

1. Prior to the primary vote, delegates must file with the state party and indicate the candidate they wish to support. They will then appear on the ballot next to that candidate during the primary vote.
2. The Primary vote occurs during which voters elect delegates directly from the ballot. They also vote for their presidential preference and the number of delegates each candidate receives is allocated based on the results of that vote.
3. The highest vote receiving delegates, based on the results of the primary vote become the district level delegates to the national convention
4. The state party committee meets to elect the at-large delegates.

Allocation of Delegates:

- A candidate must receive 15% of the vote to get delegates at either the district or state level.
- At the district level, delegates are split between the 18 congressional districts based on the Democratic make-up of those districts. Delegates are allocated proportional to the amount of vote each presidential candidate receives in each congressional district.
- At the state level, 34 at-large delegates are pledged to the candidates based proportionally on the votes of the entire state.

Filing information:

- To qualify as a district-level delegate, a statement of candidacy designating the presidential preference must be filed with the New York Democratic Party at 120 Broadway #32, New York, NY 10271.
- District-level delegates must also file to run with the state board of elections.
- District-level delegates must file in the district or sub district in which they live.
