1 tiered system

Important Dates:

- March 15, 2016: Primary vote
- April 7, 2016: Filing deadline for district-level delegates
- May 7, 2016: Congressional district caucuses
- May 9, 2016: Filing deadline for at-large delegates and PLEOs
- May 21, 2016: State convention

Number of Delegates:

- 140 District delegates
- 46 At-large delegates
- 28 Party leaders and elected officials (PLEOs)
- 31 Super-delegates
- Total: 245

Process:

1. There is a primary vote taken which determines the proportional allocation of delegates to the district and state conventions for each candidate that receives over 15% of the vote.
2. Congressional district caucuses are held to elect the district level delegates
3. At the state committee meeting, at-large delegates and PLEOs are elected by the party committee.

Allocation of Delegates:

- A candidate must receive 15% of the vote to get delegates at either the district or state level.
- At the district level, delegates are split between the 27 congressional districts based on the Democratic make-up of those districts. The delegates are elected proportional to the portion of the vote they receive in that district.
- At the state level, 46 at-large delegates and 28 PLEOs are elected based proportionally on the votes of the entire state.

Filing information:

- To qualify as a district-level delegate, at-large delegate, or PLEO, a statement of candidacy designating the presidential preference must be filed with the Florida Democratic Party online at www.fladems.com, or by mail at 214 South Bronough Street, Tallahassee, Florida, 32301.
- District-level delegates must file in the district or sub district in which they live
