1 tiered system

Important Dates:

- May 17, 2016: Primary vote
- May 20, 2016: Filing Deadline for district-level delegates, at-large delegates, and PLEOs
- June 4, 2016: Congressional district conventions
- June 18, 2016: State convention

Number of Delegates:

- 34 District delegates
- 11 At-large delegates
- 7 Party leaders and elected officials (PLEOs)
- 12 Super-delegates
- Total: 64

Process:

1. There is a primary vote taken which determines the proportional allocation of delegates to the district and state conventions for each candidate that receives over 15% of the vote. **Oregon uses and entirely mail-in primary ballot.** There are no in-person voting options.
2. Congressional district conventions are held to elect the district level delegates
3. The state convention is held to elect the at-large delegates and PLEOs.

Allocation of Delegates:

- A candidate must receive 15% of the vote to get delegates at either the district or state level.
- At the district level, delegates are split between the 5 congressional districts based on the Democratic make-up of those districts. However, the 2nd congressional district is split in two portions because of its geographical size. The delegates are pledged to candidates proportional to the portion of the vote they receive in that district.
- At the state level, 14 at-large delegates and 7 PLEOs are pledged to the candidates based proportionally on the votes of the entire state.

Filing information:

- Delegate candidates will file using an online form provided by the DPO that will be available on its website (www.dpo.org) by March 1, 2016.
- District-level delegates must file in the district or sub district in which they live.
