3-tiered system

Important Dates:

- Precinct caucus dates undetermined
- March 8, 2016: Primary vote
- March 22, 2016: County conventions
- April 8 - April 9, 2016: Congressional District Caucuses and State Convention

Number of Delegates:

- 42 District delegates
- 14 At-large delegates
- 3 Party leaders and elected officials
- Total: 59

Process:

1. Precinct caucuses are held to elect delegates to the county conventions
2. A primary vote is held to determine the number of delegates allocated to each candidate
3. County conventions meet to elect delegates to the state convention
4. A slate of at-large delegate candidates are chosen by the Credentials Committee prior to the state convention
5. The state convention meets to elect at-large and district-level delegates.
 - The district level delegates are elected by congressional district caucuses at the state convention
 - The entire state convention selects the at-large delegates from the previously slated candidates.

Allocation of Delegates:

- If a candidate receives more than 50% of the vote then they automatically receive all of the state's delegates.
- At the district level, if no candidate receives 50% of the vote, then the highest voter getter in each congressional district gets all three of its delegates.
- At the state level, if no candidate received more than 50% of the vote, at-large delegates are allocated based proportionally to any candidate that receives over 15% of the vote statewide.

Filing information:

- District level delegates must file with the state party at 520 Seymour Ave Lansing, MI 48933.
- District level delegates can only file in the congressional district in which they live
- At-large delegates do not file because they are selected by the credentials committee.
