3-tiered system

Important Dates:

- February 23, 2016: Precinct Caucuses
- March 12 – April 2, 2016: County conventions
- May 8, 2016: State convention

Number of Delegates:

- 12 District-level delegates
- 15 At-large delegates
- 3 Party leaders and elected officials
- Total: 30

Process:

1. Precinct caucuses are held to elect delegates to the county conventions. At the precinct caucuses there is also a vote to indicate the presidential preference of each precinct that determines the number of delegates pledged to each candidate.
2. County conventions meet to elect delegates to the State convention.
3. The state convention is held to elect district-level and at-large delegates according to the results of the precinct caucuses. District-level delegates are elected by the congressional district caucuses at the convention.

Allocation of Delegates:

- A candidate must receive 3.7% of the vote to get delegates at either the district or state level.
- At the district level, delegates are split between the 4 congressional districts based on the Democratic make-up of those districts. The delegates are pledged to candidates proportional to the portion of the vote they receive in that district.
- At the state level, 15 at-large delegates are pledged to the candidates based proportionally on the votes of the entire state.

Filing information:

- To qualify as a district-level delegate or an at-large delegate, a statement of candidacy designating the presidential preference must be filed with the State Republican Party at 500 S. Rancho Dr, Suite 7 Las Vegas, NV 89106
- District-level delegates must file in the district in which they live.
