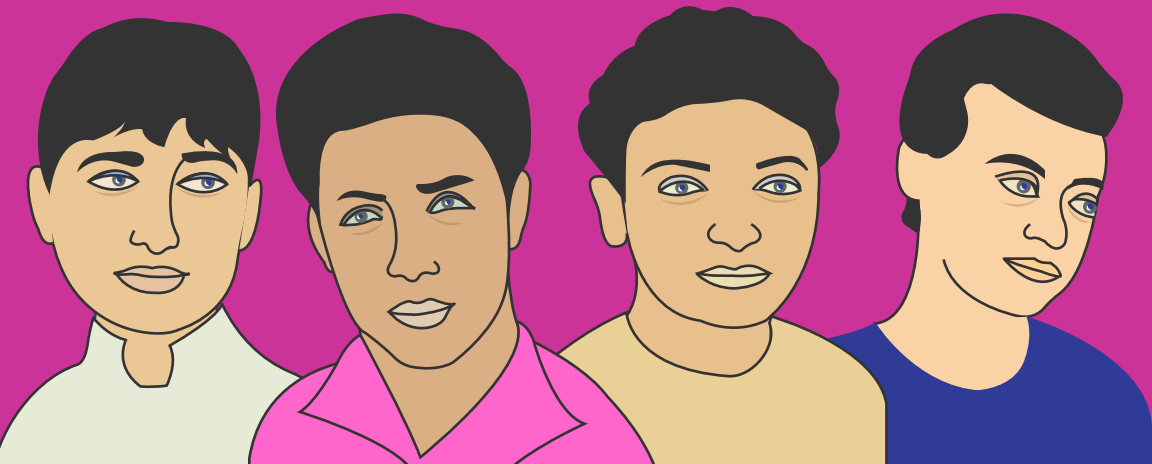

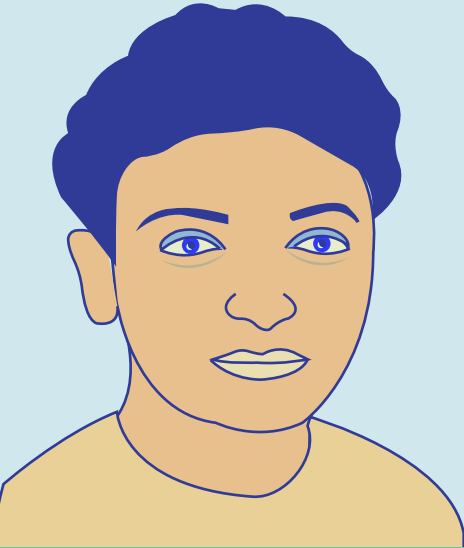
SAVE ABUDLLAH AL ZAHER

Ali Al-Nimr was arrested at age 16 and sentenced to death by beheading and crucifixion. He wants to be a lawyer when he grows up.



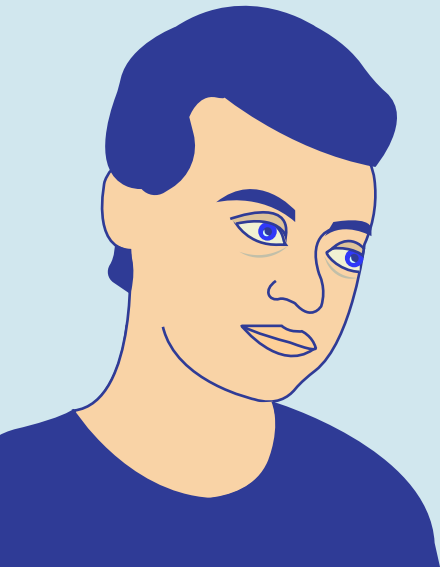
SAVE ALI AL-NIMR

Dawood Hussain Al Marhoon was first arrested at age 17. Government officials asked him to spy on others. He refused. He was sentenced to death.

Without your intervention, Mutjaba Al Suweikat will be executed for protesting for democracy . . .

Mutjaba Al Suweikat was detained at the airport on his way to come to Western Michigan University to study at the Business School. British officials tipped off Saudi authorities on his whereabouts. He was tortured into confessing and sentenced to death.
