Columbia Alumni Leaders Weekend

Each member will participate in the annual Columbia Alumni Leaders Weekend and will ensure the participation of one to five new participants for the Leaders Weekend each year.

Relationship to Schools

Each member will report to his/her school alumni organization or related organization or will regularly update these organizations regarding the work of the Columbia Alumni Association. Additionally, each member will represent his/her respective school or related organization at the CAA Board meetings.

Ambassadorship

When attending school-based events or programs, University-wide/CAA signature events, and/or at regional club programs, each member will represent the CAA either formally (as a program participant) or informally (as an engaged audience member and networker).

Donation

Each member will set an example for fellow alumni by making an annual gift to Columbia at a level appropriate to the member's means.

Since 1908, the alumni of Columbia University have been responsible for nominating six of the University's 24 trustees. University alumni are represented by the Alumni Trustee Nominating Committee (ATNC), comprised of one representative from each school. Each representative serves a four-year term and can be re-elected once. Chairmanship of the committee, a two-year term, rotates among the schools in alphabetical order.

University Senate Alumni Relations Committee

Established as a means of giving the Columbia community a voice in Columbia's operations, the Senate is the policy-making body of the University. Alumni elect two Senators and have representatives on several Senate committees.




Alumni Demographics

There are over 300,000 alumni across the world. The largest alumni population is in the New York tri-state area. Other top alumni demographics, as of 2012, are:





Alumni Populations by Region (excl. U.S.A.)


