**Territory lifestyle shot down over Labor's bad decisions**

Sports and hunting, two popular activities of the Territory lifestyle are under threat and Territorians are not happy, two petitions delivered to parliament today clearly indicate.

The Deputy Leader of the Opposition this morning received a petition from the NT Field and Game Association in relation to the season's magpie goose bag limits and restrictions placed on recreational hunters.

The Leader of the Opposition, Gary Higgins will later table a petition signed by near 1200 unhappy members of the rugby league and wider community in relation to the proposed Warren Park development.

The Leader of the Opposition said that both petitions, and subsequent disquiet at today's Public Accounts Committee (PAC) public hearing, in which the proposed Warren Park \$25 million project was discussed, indicate a government not listening to Territorians.

"The concerns raised by both the NT Field and Hunting Association and the rugby league community are genuine, well thought out and deserve a fair response the respective Minister to both petitions in this instance.

"These two petitions tabled today in parliament send a clear mandate to the Labor government, be consultative, open and transparent just as you promised Territorians you would be.

"I call on the Labor government to start listening to all stakeholders affected by your bad decisions," said Mr Higgins.
