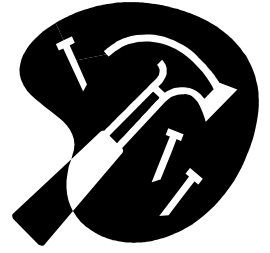

CT has a long history of bipartisan leadership on climate protection:

- 1990** – CT passed the first state-level global warming legislation to reduce carbon emissions.
- 2002** – Gov. Rowland established the **Governor's Steering Committee on Climate Change**.
- 2005** – The **Climate Change Action Plan** (CCAP) laid out 55 detailed recommendations for achieving the state's greenhouse gas (GHG) emissions reduction goals for 2010 and 2020.
- 2008** – The **Global Warming Solutions Act**, signed by Gov. Jodi Rell, established the more ambitious goal of an 80% reduction in GHG emissions by 2050.
- 2015** – **The state has no concrete plan for reaching the ambitious 2050 goal, and the Governor's Steering Committee has not met since 2011.**

- **REVIVE** the Governor's Steering Committee
- **REBOOT** the Climate Change Action Plan
- **BUILD** a climate-safe economy
- **CREATE** good, stable jobs for CT's workers
