# A Note to CVA Members

Welcome to CT Votes for Animals first Legislative Scorecard. CVA's Scorecard is a record of how CT's State Legislators voted on bills that CVA identified as priorities or otherwise believed had a significant impact on animals in the state. The scorecard is a new project for us which, with your feedback, is sure to evolve over time.

To navigate the Scorecard, find your State Representative and Senator and follow across the table to learn how they voted on key animal bills in the 2017 and 2018 sessions. Click this link to find your state legislator <https://www.cga.ct.gov/asp/menu/CGAFindLeg.asp>

A **green check mark** ✓ means they voted in agreement with CVA's position; a **red X** means they voted contrary to CVA's position on a bill; a **green star** ★ means they sponsored/cosponsored a bill supported by CVA; a **red star** ★ means they sponsored/cosponsored a bill that CVA opposed. Remember that committee votes don't include every legislator, only those sitting on the respective committee; in several cases the bill didn't go any further than the Committee, so there was never a vote in the Chamber by all the members.

This Scorecard is not a complete picture of all the animal bills introduced and considered in the legislature. That is because some were not CVA priorities and in other instances the animal bill ended up in a larger bill that had little or no relationship to the animal issue at hand, thereby not providing an accurate assessment of the legislator's vote with respect to animals. For example, a bill offering Good Samaritan protections for rescuing animals in distress in cars is not on the list. This was a 2018 CVA priority but it is hard to show on the Scorecard because there was never a vote on the original bill and the large DMV bill which passed and contained the Good Samaritan language had nothing to do with animals. In the end it all worked out and we have a law on the books with a special thanks to Representative Fred Camillo (R-151) and others for making sure protections for people helping animals is now law.

A scorecard is a record of how legislators voted but it doesn't adequately represent the work that our legislative friends have put into protecting animal welfare interests in the State. Just this year Representative Brenda Kupchick (R-132) and Representative Diana Urban (D-43) were awarded CVA's first Animal Champion Award for their continuing efforts to create better laws for CT animals. And when you look at a legislator's voting record pay attention to who has sponsored CVA priority bills. While not complete it begins to paint a picture of those who have worked hard to make a difference for animals, and we need more state legislators like them.

Election day, November 6, 2018, is swiftly approaching. This is an important election and we encourage everyone to vote. CVA doesn't endorse candidates but we're hopeful that **CVA's Legislative Scorecard for Animals** will guide its members in their decision-making process. Because this is not an all-encompassing picture, CVA encourages members to reach out to their respective State Representative and Senator and ask directly about their views on animal welfare in the State, specifically reducing animal cruelty and providing a more humane environment for all animals.

Remember, State legislative elections happen only every two years; **Vote like the life of CT's animals depend on it!**

# Bill Descriptions

## 2017

### **HB 6334 (P.A 17-167)**

#### **AN ACT REQUIRING THE REGISTRATION OF ANIMAL SHELTERS**

The law requires private, non-profit animal shelters to register with the State Department of Agriculture and to comply with regulations which ensure that facilities which house CT's adoptable pets meet humane standards of care and facilities upkeep. The bill passed unanimously in both the House and Senate and was signed by the Governor July 2017.

### **HB 6335**

#### **AN ACT PROHIBITING THE SALE AND TRADE OF IVORY AND RHINOCEROS HORN IN CONNECTICUT**

The bill prohibits any person from the purchase, sale, offer for sale, or to possess with the intent to sell, any ivory or Rhinoceros horn. Certain exemptions apply to the prohibition including elephant ivory removed from the wild prior to 1976 and objects where the total volume of ivory is less than 20 %. The bill passed the Environment Committee 17 yea and 13 Nay but was never called for a vote on the floor.

### **SB 130**

#### **AN ACT ESTABLISHING A SURCHARGE ON ANIMAL ADOPTION FEES TO FUND THE SECOND CHANCE LARGE ANIMAL REHABILITATION PROGRAM**

The bill applies a 5% surcharge on the total adoption fees of any animal from any municipal pound, private, non-profit shelter, animal adoption or rescue organization in the State. Funds collected are designated to be placed in the State's General Fund, only half of which is intended to be available to the Department of Agriculture for purposes of funding the Second Chance Large Animal Rehabilitation Program. Because of the huge outcry opposing the bill by the animal community the bill passed the Environment Committee but never came to the floor for a vote.

### **SB522**

#### **AN ACT AUTHORIZING BEAR HUNTING IN CONNECTICUT**

The bill allows hunting of black bears in Connecticut by shotgun, bow and arrow, and muzzleloader at a rate of 5% of the total black bear population in the State. It allows more bears to be hunted in rural areas to compensate for black bears relocated there from urban areas. The bill passed the Environment Committee by a vote of 18 yea to 12 Nay but was defeated by a vote on the Senate floor.

## 2018

### **HB 5355**

#### **AN ACT ESTABLISHING STANDARDS FOR THE ADEQUACY OF DOG SHELTER DURING EXTREME WEATHER CONDITIONS**

The bill establishes standards for adequate shelter for dogs when weather advisories are issued or adverse weather conditions pose a risk to the dog's health or safety. This bill was incorporated into HB 5367, a bill to study CT's dog bite law, and passed the House by a vote of 132 yea to 18 nay. The Senate adjourned before acting on this bill.

### **HB 5358**

#### **AN ACT AUTHORIZING BLACK BEAR HUNTING IN LITCHFIELD COUNTY**

The bill authorizes the hunting of black bears in Litchfield County CT and gives the Department of Energy and Environmental Protection the authority to establish rules that will allow, in the first year, to hunt up to 5% of the state-wide bear population. The bill failed in the Environment Committee by a vote of 21 Nay to 8 yea.



# Bill Descriptions *(continued)*

## **HB 5356 (Committee Vote) HB 5360 (Floor Vote)**

**P.A. 18-181**

### **AN ACT AUTHORIZING SUNDAY BOW HUNTING OF DEER ON PRIVATE PROPERTY THROUGHOUT THE STATE**

The bill (HB 5356) allows deer hunting by bow and arrow on Sunday throughout the State rather than solely in deer management zones. Rather than considered as a separate bill on the floor the deer hunting language was folded into a larger environment bill for final passage (HB 5360). The bill passed the House 109 yea to 41 nay and unanimously in the Senate

## **HB 5572**

### **AN ACT CONCERNING ACCELERATED REHABILITATION IN THE CASE OF ANIMAL ABUSE**

This bill makes the use of Accelerated Rehabilitation (AR), a pre-trial diversionary program that allows a

defendant to avoid jailtime, penalties and a record of the offense, unavailable to defendants charged in the most intentional and extreme types of cruelty – Class D felony animal abuse crimes – unless just cause is shown. The Senate adjourned before acting on this bill which passed the House by a vote of 139 yea to 5 nay.

## **SB 523**

### **AN ACT CONCERNING AN ANIMAL ABUSE REGISTRY**

This bill is based on a Tennessee State law and would establish a state-wide animal abuser registry for those convicted of animal cruelty. The bill passed the House by a vote of 138 yea to 12 nay and unanimously in the Senate. The bill could not go into effect unless \$200,000 in State funds was approved to operate the program. This bill was one of 7 bills vetoed by the Governor, none of which were overridden by the legislature.
