Referral packet includes:

- Social Summary
- Medical History (if available)
- Court Disposition Order referring to Day Treatment at CVCA
- Educational History
- Immunization Records
- All Behavior Health Records
- Special Education records (if applicable)



Exclusionary Criteria Includes

- Children adjudicated delinquent based on a history of fire setting and/or arson would be excluded from program
- Children who have a profound cognitive impairment/disorder as primary diagnosis.

Program Overview

CVCA's Day Treatment program is for youth who live in their own communities yet are unsuccessful in their current education program and require behavioral intervention to assist them in being successful in and out of school.

- On ground education offered from 7:45 am - 2:40 pm Monday thru Friday for boys and girls ages 12-19, in the 6th -12th grades
- Courses aligned with common core standards: English, Mathematics, Science, Social Studies, Art, Health/Physical Education, and Horticulture
- Special education services
- Language credits in Spanish
- GED instruction
- Psycho-Educational Groups: Drug and Alcohol, Anger Management, Vocational Education, Life Skills, and DBT Skills
- Breakfast and lunch provided
- Individualized transportation plans
- Administrative support and leadership



All youth in CVCA's Day Treatment Program also receive dialectical behavioral therapy psycho-education groups, family and community engagement, and life skills training as part of their daily regimen.

A court order is required for attendance.
