

## **DID JUDICIAL DELEGATE CANDIDATE VOTING** **PROPOSED CHANGE**

DID has 8 Judicial Delegates and 8 alternates (6 from 65C and 10 from 66B). Delegates are required to vote as a bloc at the Judicial Convention in order to give our club greater strength and influence in the process.

### Current Procedure:

- Any member may participate in any Judicial Delegate or Task Force event except for the Convention, where only delegates (or alternates) may vote.
- The Judicial Delegate “bound” vote is decided upon by a vote of the members who are in attendance at the Judicial Candidate Forum.
- All 9 Judicial delegates (or alternates) are “bound” to vote together at the Judicial Convention with the vote results from the Forum.

### Proposed Procedure:

- Any member may participate in any Judicial Delegate or Task Force event except for the Judicial Convention, where only delegates (or alternates) may vote.
- After the Forum, all club members in attendance vote using Ranked Choice Voting (RCV). Any Judicial Delegate not in attendance may vote by proxy.<sup>1</sup>
- After the full club member vote, then Judicial Delegates and alternates, vote (RCV). Any Judicial Delegate or alternate not in attendance may vote by signed proxy, where the proxy votes on behalf of the Delegate.<sup>2</sup> The Judicial Delegate vote binds the club and all of the Judicial Delegates and alternates at the Judicial Convention.
- All DID Judicial delegates and alternates are “bound” to vote together at the Judicial Convention.

Purpose/Goal of Changes: To give more ownership to the Judicial Delegates and encourage involvement in the process. It leaves less up to chance of who is able
