

Resolution by Downtown Independent Democrats in Support of Electronic Voting and Ranked-Choice Voting for Club Business

Whereas:

- 1. In New York State we are prohibited from having gatherings of more than 10 people or more because of the COVID Pandemic:
- DID has tested and approved of electronic voting at the April 2020 Membership Meeting, and:
- 3. Ranked-Choice Voting, also known as Instant-Runoff Voting, has proved to be an effective and democratic method of voting.
- 4. New York City voters have overwhelmingly passed a City Charter change to use Ranked-Choice Voting for city primaries and special elections.

Therefore be it resolved that:

- 1. The use of electronic voting is allowed at any DID meeting when determined most appropriate by the Executive Committee.
- Voting by a ranked preferential voting method in the form of Ranked-Choice Voting or other options is permitted and encouraged for DID club business, including the passage of Resolutions and Endorsements, and the elections of DID Officers and Executive Committee.
- 3. As needed, the DID Executive Committee is authorized to study the various ranked preferential voting methods, determine the most appropriate voting methodology to use in a given vote or election, report back to membership its findings, and recommend preferred voting option(s) for the future.
