In Support of Federal/NYS Racial Justice Laws

May 26, 2021

Whereas:

- 1. We recently passed or are nearing the one-year anniversaries of Breonna Taylor's and George Floyd's killings and the mass uprising of protests against police brutality and racism that followed.
- 2. The Biden Administration has made it a top priority to tackle issues of racial equity,¹ and President Biden has asked Congress to pass the George Floyd Justice in Policing Act, a police reform bill that "increases accountability for law enforcement misconduct, restricts the use of certain policing practices, enhances transparency and data collection, and establishes best practices and training requirements,²" before the one-year anniversary of Floyd's death. The bill passed in the House of Representatives on March 3, 2021 but has not yet passed in the Senate.
- 3. In March 2020, Breonna Taylor was killed during the execution of a no-knock warrant in Louisville, Kentucky. Her killing has led to increased attention to forcible police entries, and the introduction of legislation to limit their use and increase oversight in many cities

and states - notably passing in Louisville and Virginia. Most governments don't require reporting of SWAT operations, but according to a New York Times investigation, at least 81 civilians and 13 police officers were killed nationwide in the execution of no-knock warrants between 2010 and 2016³. Legislation (Senate Bill S11⁴ and Assembly Bill A2683⁵) has been introduced in the New York State Legislature to ban no-knock raids, except in the most severe circumstances, and add additional reforms and oversight to all warrants. Legislation to ban no knock warrants has been introduced in the U.S. Senate⁶ and a ban on no knock warrants in drug cases is included in the George Floyd Justice in Policing Act.⁷

- 4. According to the Brennan Center for Justice, as of March 2021, legislators have introduced 361 bills with restrictive voting provisions in 47 states⁸. Many of these measures are considered racially biased, and if enacted would significantly increase barriers to voting for people of color.
 - a. In March 2021, the House of Representatives passed the For The People Act (H.R. 1), a sweeping electoral reform bill to address "voter access, election integrity and security, campaign finance, and ethics for the three branches of government⁹." The bill has not passed in the Senate.
 - b. The John Lewis Voting Rights Advancement Act 10 would re-establish and reform elements of the Voting Rights Act of 1965 that were gutted by the Supreme Court's 2013 decision in Shelby County v. Holder¹¹, including the preclearance requirements for states with a history of voter suppression and racial discrimination when making changes to election procedure.

Therefore Downtown Independent Democrats resolves to:

- 1. Call upon our elected officials in Congress to support and advocate for the passage of the George Floyd Justice in Policing Act.
- Call upon our elected officials in the New York State legislature to co-sponsor Senate Bill S11 and Assembly Bill A2683 to limit no knock warrants.
- 3. Call upon our elected officials in Congress to support and advocate for the passage of the John Lewis Voting Rights Advancement Act (H.R.4) and the For the People Act (H.R.1 and S.1).
