Funding boost for Wisdom College

Students at Catholic and Independent schools in Brisbane's south will soon be benefiting from new state-of-the-art learning environments.

Member for Stretton Duncan Pegg today announced \$400 000 in infrastructure funding for non-state schools in the Stretton electorate.

"The Palaszczuk Government is committed to providing every student in Queensland with access to a quality education," he said.

"We know quality learning environments support quality teaching and learning.

"We want to ensure that our schools cater for enrolment growth and continue to be quality learning environments that give students the best chance at success."

Mr Pegg said the funding included \$400,000 for 4 new classrooms, a new covered play area and new administration areas at Wisdom College, Calamvale

Member for Stretton Duncan Pegg said the works were part of the Palaszczuk Government's \$92 million commitment to non-state schools in Queensland in this year's budget.

"The Palaszczuk Government supports parents' right to choose a state or non-state education for their children," Mr Pegg said.

"We want to ensure every student is benefiting from quality classrooms, no matter where they go to school."

Member for Stretton Duncan Pegg said the investment in non-state schools would support construction jobs across the state.

"Not only are we seeing improvements to schools across the state, but every project is providing valuable jobs for tradies and training opportunities for apprentices," Mr Pegg said.
