Work complete at Kuraby Special School

Member for Stretton Duncan Pegg today announced \$165,000 upgrade works at Kuraby Special School were recently completed.

Mr Pegg said Building and Asset Services had delivered the work.

“This project is part of our record \$667 million school infrastructure program to improve our state schools,” Mr Pegg said.

Mr Pegg said the work included \$165,000 to refurbish Block 6 classrooms.

“We want to ensure that our schools cater for enrolment growth and continue to be quality learning environments that give students the best chance at success.

“We know that quality learning environments support quality teaching and learning.

“That’s why we are committed to improving school facilities for our students and teachers.”

Mr Pegg said construction work across the state supported jobs and training opportunities for apprentices.

“Our school infrastructure program is not only building better schools in Stretton but also providing valuable jobs for tradies and training opportunities for apprentices,” he said.

“At least 10 percent of all construction and maintenance work carried out on state schools will be done by apprentices ensuring we continue to develop skills locally.”
