How would you use the platform of this elected office to advance gender equity?

I will work to ensure all students have equal access to a quality education in Dublin. It important as a district to look at the disaggregated data on state testing and other formal assessments to ensure there are not significant gender disparities in results and look at what programs are being put into

place to address them if they are significant disparities. I will work to ensure Title IX protections are fully enforced. I would like to add my voice to the other female elected officials across Dublin to advance gender equity across the city.

How will you work to end discrimination based on age, race, religion, sex, sexual orientation, gender identity, immigration status, marital status, socioeconomic status, and disability?

It is important to ensure programs are available for all students and that they see themselves represented in their teachers, their curriculum and the books in their school/classroom libraries. It is important that all families in the district feel comfortable accessing school programs and services regardless of their status in any of these categories. It is also important that district curriculum is not just compliant with state FAIR Act requirements on paper, but in day to day implementation. We must ensure that all school-based activities are inclusive and include all types of families. As a 20 year Special Education teacher in a nearby district, I have worked to ensure my students have full access everything at their school and would be a voice for all students with disabilities in Dublin as well.

What do you think are the top 5 issues that impact women that are relevant to the elected office you are seeking? (Please rank in order of priority)

1) Providing a quality education to all students 2) Attracting and retaining quality teachers through salary and benefits that at least comparable to surrounding districts, 3) communicating with constituents to ensure all voices are heard and represented on district committees and within district programs 4) Ensuring students and staff are able to return to campus as soon as safely possible. 5) Ensuring equity in opportunities for all students and families to participate in school and district programs.

What have you done to mentor women?

I have been working at the same school for the past 20 years. During that time I have transitioned from a full time Resource Specialist to a Teacher on Special Assignment. One of my main roles in that position has been to support our new special education preschool teachers, service providers, and Resource Specialists (most of whom have been women). I am proud that most of them are still working in the district in the area of Special Education, which is a career with a high rate of turnover. I have also worked to collaborate with and support other new Resource Specialists across the district.

What is the gender breakdown of your campaign staff/volunteers?	My consultant, treasurer and I are all female. I have a number of female volunteers as well. I am still organizing my volunteers, but it will likely be 80-90% female.
