

The Environment Centre NT has produced independent scorecards assessing the policies of the major parties ahead of the Northern Territory 2020 election. We invited major parties to complete a survey, to demonstrate how their policies stack up across different environmental issues.

Will your party implement a Climate Change Act to legislate a target of net zero emissions by 2050, including interim 5 yearly targets? The CLP supports the target of net zero emissions by 2050.
The CLP will create a task force within the Department of Chief Minister to explore specific options to help the Territory achieve zero net emissions, including carbon offsets, such as increased utilisation of carbon-farming, carbon sequestration options and improving energy efficiency of the public and private sectors.



Territory Alliance will release a comprehensive renewables and environment policy ahead of the NT General Election, which is in addition to our Ban Fracking Policy. This policy will include legislated emissions targets for 2030 (at 50%) and for 2050 (at 90%). We will not be legislating five-year incremental targets, but we will provide significant funding into renewable energy research.

Yes, but not legislated (no Act). Territory Labor was the Territory's first – and only – party to deliver a climate change policy and set a target of net zero emission by 2050. Our Climate Change Response and Three-Year Action Plan includes undertaking detailed emissions analysis to identify a trajectory towards net zero and identification of potential suitable interim targets and timeframes. The Minister for Climate Change will also provide a progress report to parliament each year. The CLP and Mills scrapped our climate change and renewables target when they were elected. BAN FRACKING

Will your party create a permanent ban on oil and gas fracking, including immediate legislative changes to prevent new fracking environmental management plans (EMP's) from being approved?



No, the CLP supports a well-regulated onshore gas industry and will implement all 135 of the Pepper Inquiry recommendations.



Territory Alliance is the only major party that has announced a Ban on unconventional hydraulic fracturing.



No. Territory Labor are implementing all 135 recommendations of the Scientific Inquiry into Hydraulic Fracturing to develop the most comprehensive onshore gas regulation in Australia, if not the world. We will always protect the rights of Traditional Owners to determine what activities occur on their land. The CLP's plan for fracking is weak and dangerous and Terry Mills keeps changing his mind about whether he supports fracking. There's only one party you can trust when it comes to protecting the environment: Labor.



The NT Greens support a legislated ban on fracking and would immediately cease the approval of any further EMPs. The NT Greens support a rapid transition away from fossil fuel production and use, Australia wide. The implementation of this transition would be legislated by a Climate Change Act

Public funding to ensure proper regulation in line with the Pepper Inquiry recommendations is necessary and prudent.



Territory Alliance is the only major party that has announced a Ban on unconventional hydraulic fracturing. Territory Alliance have been clear that no public funding will be used to support the unconventional fracturing industry.

Economic Reconstruction Commission - responsible for providing advice to the Chief Minister and Cabinet on accelerating the Territory's economic rebound and positioning the Territory for growth – has recommended in the Commission's First Report (July 2020) that the Territory and Australian governments jointly undertake a study into an electricity highway based on high voltage direct current (HVDC) transmission links between Darwin and Alice Springs. Other: Announcement to come. The Territory Labor Government recognises the important role that Aboriginal Rangers undertake in conservation and land management on Aboriginal land and sea country and will soon make an announcement about how we can continue to support their efforts. We have delivered on our promise to increase funding and powers for Aboriginal Rangers to protect the environment and create jobs on country. We provided \$4.1 million over two years for one-off capital grants of up to \$100,000 to help ranger groups to purchase essential items like vehicles. boats and radio and communications equipment.



Yes. NT Greens consider that all land and seas in the NT need to primarily be managed by traditional owners and Aboriginal communities. This will restore and protect our natural systems, help reduce emissions and capture carbon to tackle climate change. This work must be considered an essential service and be paid for accordingly. There are extensive social, cultural, economic and environmental benefits of investing in this essential work.



This funding helped 46 ranger groups purchase capital items. We also committed \$8 million for a Conservation and Land Management Fund to support land management on Aboriginal land and sea country. The Territory Labor Government has provided \$5.8 million to date — supporting 30 ranger groups across the Northern Territory — with the remaining funding to be announced soon. In addition, our Government amended the Territory Parks and Wildlife Conservation Act 2019 to strengthen the role of Aboriginal Rangers as conservation officers in the Northern Territory by providing greater powers for the protection and management of traditional lands — providing for better environmental and cultural management of country by the 1000 Aboriginal Rangers across the Territory. This Act delivers a key

We will continue to honour all National Partnership Agreement on Remote Housing which will see \$550 million in Commonwealth funding over five years matched by the Northern Territory to 2023. Reports of a lack of oversight and failure to meet the objectives of the current remote housing program are concerning. A Country Liberal Government is committed to meeting procurement guidelines and targets to increase local employment and enterprise outcomes for Aboriginal people. We will review the program's progress and improve outcomes for remote communities through investment in remote housing.



Housing overcrowding continues to be a significant problem in the Territory and we note the continued failures of Labor and the CLP in addressing this issue. Territory Alliance have announced we would create a joint Territory Commonwealth Indigenous Affairs department which will have specific mandate to aggressively target the issue of overcrowding.



Yes. We are already delivering on this commitment. We promised to deliver a \$1.1billion, ten year program to build and upgrade remote housing and that's what we are doing. So far this government has built or upgraded 2000 houses. We also fought tooth and nail to get the Federal Government to match our funding and they finally agreed to invest \$550million over 5 years, matching our commitment. The CLP built one house in their last two years of government and Terry Mills has no interest in remote housing.



Yes. The NT Greens are committed to ending overcrowding and improving living conditions, livelihoods and health. The Greens strongly believe housing is a human right. The Greens have a national agenda to address the housing crisis, which will stimulate the economy.
