In an environment of urgent concern, do we have an ethical obligation to use the law to try to effect the change needed to preserve a safe climate?





Court and Compliance Watch

Recycling company fined for dust emission

The NSW Environment Protection Authority (EPA) has fined Greenacre Recycling Pty Ltd \$15,000 for failing to contain dust pollution at its waste depot.

EPA officers visited the company's Greenacre site in November 2017 and observed dust pollution caused by unloading deliveries. Further checks confirmed that the company's existing dust control measures were ineffective for the activities taking place on site.

Waste facility fined for dust and stockpile breaches

The NSW EPA has fined a Padstow waste facility \$30,000 for dust and stockpile breaches at their Gow St site.

EPA officers inspected the Recycling Centre in September 2017 and observed dust blowing off a waste stockpile onto a neighbouring property and a waste stockpile stacked higher than the allowable 4m limit. Boundary fences at the site were also found to be ineffective at stopping dust during windy weather. The EPA issued a \$15,000 fine for the dust emissions and another \$15,000 fine for the stockpile exceedance. It also issued an official caution for the inadequate fencing.

Waste company fined for poor waste storage

The NSW EPA has fined Dump It Recycling Centre Pty Ltd \$15,000 for storing waste outside in an uncovered area contrary to the conditions of its environment protection licence.

EPA officers have issued previous warnings to the company that the piles needed to be moved and stored in an enclosed area, as per the licence conditions. Despite warnings and cautions, a January 2018 EPA inspection found that waste was still being stored outside the building and the EPA issued a \$15,000 fine.

Regional Forests Agreements review

In this submission, EDO NSW raises five overarching issues on the operation of the NSW RFAs and the five-yearly review process, including the development of *A Report of Progress with Implementation of NSW Regional Forest Agreements: Second & Third five-yearly reviews July 2004 – June 2014 (Progress Report)*.

Our 5 key areas of concern are:

1. RFA reviews have not occurred in the required timeframes
2. Poor community consultation
3. Lack of third party civil enforcement and a culture of non-compliance
4. Limited data on environmental indicators
5. Need for transparent forestry governance and operational requirements.

Improving Mine Rehabilitation in NSW

As a community legal centre specialising in public interest environmental law, EDO NSW has commented extensively on the management of mining in NSW. Mine

rehabilitation should be considered as an integrated component in the overall management regime and our comments on mine rehabilitation are made in the context of our previous recommendations on improving the management of mining in NSW.

Our submission broadly responds to the proposals outlined in the Discussion Paper but in our view, these proposals are insufficient to ensure appropriate management and regulation of mine rehabilitation. We therefore also provide comment on areas where further work is required.

- **Draft Aboriginal Cultural Heritage Bill**

This draft Bill proposes a new framework for the management and protection of Aboriginal cultural heritage in NSW. The new legislation would establish a new Aboriginal Cultural Heritage Authority empowered to make regulations, policies and guidelines that provide the detailed rules for how the new arrangements will work.

- **Management and Use of Commonwealth Environmental Water**

The House of Representatives Standing Committee on the Environment and Energy has resolved to inquire into the 2016-17 annual report of the Department of the Environment and Energy. In doing so, the Committee will inquire into and report on the management and use of Commonwealth environmental water.

The Committee will be conducting public hearings and site inspections to gather evidence from stakeholders.

- **NSW Regional Forests Agreements**

The NSW and Commonwealth Governments are seeking comment on the renewal of NSW Regional Forest Agreements, including potential changes and improvements.

There are three Regional Forest Agreements (RFAs) in NSW: Eden (expiring on 26 August 2019); North East (expiring on 31 March 2020); and Southern (expiring on 24 April 2021).

The Preliminary Regional Issues Assessment (PRIA) for Bancannia and Pondie Range Troughs involves consideration of social, environmental and economic benefits or risks relating to potential new release areas for gas exploration in Far West NSW. It is an early assessment as part of the [Strategic Release Framework](#).
