## HOPE & HEART

In March 2018, the Hope & Heart Shelter opened its doors, providing a safe haven for women and children impacted by domestic and sexual violence. ELAWC has provided emergency shelter and housing assistance to over 150 women and their children. Our goal is to prevent chronic homelessness and help survivors build a safe home for themselves and their children.

### *Mariana's Story*

Mariana, a young woman with two small children needed shelter and protection. While applying for work and finishing her last semester at East Los Angeles College, she lived at ELAWC's emergency shelter and received services and support to help move her life forward. With a new job and her education complete, she moved to a two-bedroom apartment and started a new job, giving her children, and Mariana, a better life and hope for a promising future. According to the World Health Organization, violence, especially against women and girls, affects physical and mental health, delays economic, social, and personal development, impacts educational outcomes, escalates costs for social services and healthcare, and leads to increased rates of poverty, incarceration, substance abuse, disease and death.

## *The Impact in 2018*

- > Over 10,000 individuals received services
- > Responded to 3500 hotline calls
- > Housing assistance to 150 survivors and their children, since March 2018
- > 86% of those served live under the poverty line
- > Trained over 3500 healthcare professionals on domestic and sexual assault violence
- > Organized 5 collectives with 140 Promotoras reaching over 2,200 community members
- > 641 emergency hospital responses
- > 1,500 local youth received violence prevention education
