## A Day Without a Bag - Thursday, Dec. 15, 2011

Heal the Bay's annual "Day Without a Bag" is coming up on Dec. 15, so look for free giveaways of re-usable shopping bags just in time for holiday gift shopping. Day Without a Bag raises awareness about the important



environmental impact you can make with your personal consumer choices. Last year, over 25,000 fashionable, functional re-usable shopping tote bags were given away in L.A. County at 171 giveaway locations. This year for the first time, the L.A. County Public Library is giving out 8,000 bags at 85 library branches.

A Day Without a Bag focuses on educating Southland shoppers to adopt more sustainable practices during the holidays and coming year. Holiday shopping generates a tremendous amount of waste, including one-time use shopping bags, so it's a perfect time to make a big difference. The event also aims to reduce the use of single-use plastic bags.

More than 6 billion plastic bags are used in LA County each year, and only about 5% of them are recycled. Disposable bags cost our fiscally strained cities up to 17 cents per bag for disposal. Millions of them end up in our oceans, where they kill marine life and harm fisheries, and damage the natural beauty that is at the heart of coastal tourism.

Plastic bags are made from non-renewable fossil fuels. Their production requires petroleum and natural gas, both non-renewable resources that are environmentally destructive, create more greenhouse gases, and increase our dependency on foreign oil. More than 4,000 barrels of oil are used every day to make plastic bags.

A single reusable bag has the potential to eliminate hundreds of plastic bags over its lifetime.

Day Without a Bag is organized by Heal the Bay, and sponsored by partners City of L.A., Department of Public Works, Union Bank, and 99 Cents Only Stores.

## Re-use, Recycle, Rejoice!

Make it a green holiday this year and recycle your tree! In addition to gift wrapping paper, boxes and gift packaging, you can recycle your Christmas tree. Every year, the City of Los Angeles offers residents the opportunity to recycle Christmas trees. Dead, dry trees can be a fire hazard, and when they go to landfills, they release greenhouse gases that contribute to climate change. When the trees are recycled, they are turned into mulch and re-used for gardening and landscaping. You can even get free mulch for your own garden!

Remove all ornaments, decorations and the tree stand. Cut the tree into pieces and place it in your green waste bin. If it does not fit, place the whole tree at the curb and the Bureau of Sanitation will pick it up. You can also bring it to one of the City's drop-off locations. ## Gift Wrapping & Packaging

Please do not burn gift wrapping in the fireplace once the holiday gifts are opened. They often contain dyes and plastics that release toxins into the air. Most gift wrapping can be recycled in the blue bin. You can also re-use gift wrapping to wrap other gifts.

## Free Mulch for Your Garden...



You can get free mulch for your garden from the City's Mulch Giveaway Program! The free mulch is made from recycled yard trimmings and other "green waste" from the green bins.

Recycling green waste is an important way to reduce the amount of organic material that goes into landfills. When plant materials go into landfills, they emit large amounts of the greenhouse gas methane, which contributes to climate change.

California law (AB 939) requires all cities to reduce the amount of waste they sent to landfills by 50% by the year 2000. The City of Los Angeles met and surpassed that goal (to learn more [click here](#)), and has adopted the further goal of reducing landfilled waste by 70% by the year 2015. One of the largest single components of the City's waste stream is greenwaste.

## Place Palm Fronds and Tree Branches Next to Green Bin...

The Bureau of Sanitation is urging L.A. residents to place palm fronds and tree branches that have blown down in the recent heavy winds next to the green bins to be picked up.

If palm fronds and branches are placed next to the green used for residential yard trimmings on regular trash collection days, they will be picked up together with the green waste and turned into mulch. This will help residents to keep their yards, streets and sidewalks clean in the wake of the strong wind storms.

Last Saturday, Sanitation crews conducted sweeps to clear palm fronds through Los Angeles. Additional Saturday sweeps are planned until the wind-related debris is cleared. 




