## **Summary of our key issues/concerns**

- Private tree protection is needed
- Canopy target should be higher, maybe 45%
- Municipal staff training for all departments that work with trees
- Commitment to urban woodland stewardship
- Plant native and ensure canopy coverage becomes equitable across city
- Need timeline, metrics and funding commitments
