




LESLIE CAWLFIELD



So much of the work at FernLeaf - both inside and outside the classroom - is a process, like an ongoing conversation. This is a snapshot into the collaborative effort between students and their teacher as they all work to move the process, and the conversation forward.

SICK CHILD POLICY AT FERNLEAF

The health and wellness of the school community should be balanced with the student's educational needs. We understand that balancing work with caring for sick children at home is a challenge, but when students attend school when they are sick it disrupts the educational experience of others and increases the likelihood that the illness will spread throughout the classroom and school.

Students should stay home when they have any of the following symptoms:

Fever

Vomiting or diarrhea

Unidentified rash

Chicken Pox

Strep throat: until treated by a physician

Conjunctivitis ("pink eye"): until student has been on medication for 24 hours

Classroom teachers, the school nurse, and School Director are authorized to send a child home from school if his/her condition warrants this.

The child will be released to parents; if parents are not available, s/he will be released to an individual designated by parents on the Student Information Form.

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
