FPC is a nonprofit, nonprofit grassroots organization that serves to protect and defend the Constitution of the United States and the People's rights, privileges and immunities deeply rooted in this Nation's history and tradition—especially the inalienable, fundamental, and individual right to keep and bear arms—through advocacy, legal action, research, education, outreach, and other efforts.
