Bob asked me to assist him in responding to you and I am happy to do so.

First, I appreciate your close reading of the Code of Conduct - you've raised a good question. I think I can clarify that point for you. That part of the Code of Conduct is not intended to address possession of firearms off campus and away from team activities. It's meant to refer to the University rules about illegal possession or use of firearms by students and possession of firearms on University property, and to indicate our department policy against possessing firearms during team activities. We recognize some of our student-athletes may own firearms that they keep off-campus and away from team activities. I hope this helps clear up your question for this time around. We'll consider how to clarify this in the code in the future.
