Growing the Greenway Developments—site, city RFP (20 minutes)

- The city will be releasing their RFP for community gardens on the Greenway in June or July
 - Likely that we will have free water
 - o Galvez site is the site of the historical gardens
 - o Soil is already remediated from heavy metal contamination
 - o Sojourner Truth is no longer open on weekends, so it presents less of an advantage
- Committee decided to move forward with community garden on Galvez site, and not start at Sojourner Truth

- Bed type & size
 - Height
 - Kids, seniors
 - Size
 - o Variety of dimensions?
 - How many different sizes?
 - Will depend on what the growers want.
 - How many large beds do we need? Of what size(s)?
 - ADA accessible beds—table height so people in wheelchairs can reach over the bed (with their legs under it), rather than having to lean over with difficulty.
 - Style
 - High visibility site
 - Materials options—cinder blocks and wood can both be painted
 - Recycled materials (plastic) lasts longer
 - o Cost
 - Layout
 - Between the beds—gravel for weed maintenance
- Fence type & size
 - o Height
 - Security
 - Welcoming feel
 - Kids climbing
 - we want a solid fence with a solid top that kids won't get hurt on.
 - McDonough 15's fence is good.
 - To allow for garden growth, we could design to keep the fence up and use it as a trellis, open up a portion of it to expand to the rest of the garden
 - Security
 - Type of gate/lock
 - Durability of material
 - Style
 - High visibility
 - o Growing
 - Trellis for vine plants
 - Sponsorship opportunities
