## 1. Introduction (5 minutes)

a. President Jerry Ferguson called the meeting to order, and invited all attendees to give an update on how they are holding up during the coronavirus pandemic

# 2. <u>Budget Discussion</u> (10 minutes)

- a. The pandemic will impact the club's fundraising ability, and we have already postponed the spring fundraiser
  - i. However, the club has a decent amount of funds in the bank, and is not currently spending much due to the pandemic
- b. The Board agreed that this time is an opportunity to look at new networking, outreach, recruiting, and social media opportunities, and how these can help shore up the club's finances

### 3. Building Membership (15 minutes)

- a. The Board raised the possibility of a drop in membership due to fewer recruiting opportunities
  - i. The club often receives a large membership boost via the Spring fundraiser, which has been canceled
- b. The Board discussed ways to reach out to the community during this time; ideas included:
  - i. The FFDC Neighbors Program, which provides grocery delivery and other assistance to those in need
  - ii. Coordination with local businesses
  - iii. Promoting activism around the upcoming elections
  - iv. Investment in social media and local advertising
  - v. Holding more virtual events e.g., game nights; movie watch parties; debate watch parties

vi. Promoting the Facebook discussion group, which has already grown rapidly and proven to be a great forum for engagement

# 4. <u>Upcoming Events</u> (10 minutes)

- a. Spring fundraiser:
  - i. Bohemian Spirit has given the club the option to reschedule the fundraiser to a date in June
    - 1. The Board agreed that this is too soon, and we should wait until at least the fall

#### b. Summer barbecue:

- i. As the club's gift to the community, the BBQ has always been a free event
  - 1. However, Matt Lombardi suggested using it as a fundraiser in light of the cancelation of prior money-raising events
    - a. The Board authorized the events committee to explore this option

## 5. Zoom Issues (15 Minutes)

- a. Alex Bores gave the Board an update on issues surrounding Zoom, the videoconferencing software the club has been using for meetings
  - i. Zoom had announced a policy change that would have required the club to purchase an upgraded account
    - 1. However, it later canceled these changes, and our current plan remains the best option
  - ii. Recent news stories have raised concerns over privacy and security issues surrounding Zoom
    - 1. However, none of these affect the club, as they are more relevant to the use of Zoom for schooling purposes
- b. Alex proposed using password protection for all meetings, as we did for today's meeting
  - i. Zoom can create a link with password embedded, so invitees do not have to enter it themselves
    - 1. The club can use a link without the password on public sites, which would avoid "zoom-bombing"
  - ii. Other Board members expressed concern that password protection would dissuade participation
    - 1. For instance, our last meeting was so well-attended because Representative Maloney posted the link on her website
- c. A motion was considered to *not* have a password for meetings
  - i. The vote was tied, at 6 to 6, and the motion did not carry (thus, all meetings will continue to be password-protected)

## 6. Upcoming Meetings (10 minutes)

- a. April meeting agenda:
  - i. Guest speaker City Council Member Mark Levine Chair of the Committee on Health

- ii. Guest speaker on rent relief (tbd)
- iii. Other electeds may want to provide an update as well
- b. May meeting agenda:
  - i. City Council Member Carlina Rivera, Chair of Hospitals Committee
    - 1. Esther Yang can reach out to her office
  - ii. Speaker on virtual activism (tbd)
- c. June meeting agenda:
  - i. Presidential endorsement vote, if there is still a competitive primary

## 7. Activism Update (10 minutes)

- a. Medical worker whistleblower protection:
  - i. The healthcare working group drafted a <u>resolution</u> to provide whistleblower protection to healthcare workers
    - 1. Hospitals are putting workers under gag orders on and threating to fire anyone who speaks out about bad conditions
  - ii. The Board voted unanimously to approve of and promote the resolution, and to reach out to our elected officials on the issue
- b. Rent relief:
  - i. The Board discussed ways to promote rent relief bills, and agreed to follow up with our elected officials
- c. Vote-by-mail:
  - i. The Board voted unanimously to support universal vote-by-mail
    - 1. The elections working group will look further into whether the Governor can order this measure unilaterally Board votes to advocate for vote by mail
