Headlines from Northumbria: what have we been banging on about recently?

Dr Paul Williams - Labour's candidate for Hartlepool

Where do we start with Dr Paul Williams? His support of Saudi Arabia? His tolerance for imperialistic violence? His questionable dinner party conversations about Tory women who happen to be mothers? His absence of unequivocal support for a substantial pay rise to his NHS colleagues? I mean, he's trying – bless him. He parachuted in there with nothing but a discomfitingly sympathetic stance on privatised health-care and a dream of running his own lucrative maternity unit populated exclusively by aesthetically pleasing Tories (he'd have a league table in his office so he can rigorously determine who is his favourite). But, he's quickly found that the world, shockingly, is not as it was in 2015 when you could get away with being a cipher that people project the party-line on. He is being held accountable for falling short as a remotely ideal representative for Hartlepool. Yet, there are people in the Labour party who decry us 'splitting the vote'. Let's face up to reality, we're not splitting the vote - the vote was split as it was, because entitled parties have assumed they can demand people's loyalty for being slightly less nauseating than the alternative. As much as we'd love to revel in being the cause, we're just a symptom. I'm afraid, good Dr Williams, Hartlepool and the rest of the North have contracted a severe case of optimism around actually being democratically represented and, for you, this condition is terminal.

Tory intervention into Liverpool City Council

We can't ignore that Liverpool city council seems to have been run by a bunch of charmless, pompous scallies whose claims to have been toiling selflessly for the people of the city are evidently entirely jarg. However any provincial greed or gangsterism is dwarfed by the

institutional corruption that ideologically infuses the Tory party. Liverpool city council let the city down, but their failings are nothing when held up to the swaggering negligence of the Tories. Which is why the Tories imposing their input on the city is so problematic – they are not a solution. Why respond to a problem by creating a bigger problem? It's like reacting to finding a rat in your home by asking Piers Morgan to move in. No excuses for the council, but their conduct didn't 'lead the Tories to our doorstep' as reported by The Liverpool Echo. They may have left the door off the latch, but the Tories were lurking ready to scurry past and sell off our furniture. In 3 years we'll get back in to find nothing but bare rooms and an unflushed bog. This is a premeditated attack on the city by a party that disdains Liverpool's recalcitrance and refusal to submit itself to the lies of the Tory press. It's also an attack condoned by a Labour Party who fails to recognise that their support in our Northern cities and towns is not unconditional. Lucky there's another party for them to turn to, eh?

Bristol Police Brutality

The recent round of protests in Bristol being met with a barrage of violence by the police is deeply, deeply disturbing. The police need to be held accountable for their actions. An investigation is essential - there should be serious, lengthy and interrogative questions around the competence and possible presence of insidious intent of anyone who authorised an escalation in force. All officers exploiting that instruction with unprovoked aggression should not only face disciplinary action, but criminal charges. Let's be real, the police need not act like that. Speaking personally, I am a mental health nurse and have worked closely beside many intelligent, compassionate officers mindful of their duty to the communities they're immersed in. Not holding the police to a high standard does a disservice to all those officers who do want to help people, rather than brutalise and oppress them. As a mental health nurse I myself

have detained people; I'm fully aware of the reasons you try to avoid doing that, because it is genuinely traumatic to anyone you inflict it on. I've been looked in the eye by people I have both physically restrained and deprived of their liberty; that look should sear your soul. If the officers involved in the draconian actions in Bristol don't have that reaction, that's often due to systemic pressures within the police force having cauterised their humanity. This shit drags us all down and we need to combat it with empathy for some of those on the other side of the barricade; those who perhaps know that this isn't right, but feel too disempowered to challenge the rationale behind their orders. We will never toe the mainstream line of unerringly supporting the police as an institution, but we should have the back of the working people of the police who want to be an asset to communities, rather than a force to be clumsily wielded by those who profit from weaponizing them.

Public control for Manchester's buses

Andy Burnham's plan to bring Manchester buses into public control has rightly been applauded, but it's a startling reminder of how rabidly free-market hegemony has mauled the North that such a common sense move seems radical. It's not quite what we'd want for Manchester, it's still necessary for a private operator to run the service, even if their thirst for profiteering will be curbed by local council regulation. A publically owned bus company would provide better service, value and security for workers within the sector. However, to be fair to the mayor, doing this is not within his power. Burnham may belong to a different party, but we're not afraid to praise people willing to do what's right for the North regardless of their political allegiances – though a hefty slice of the credit should go to campaigns like 'We Own it' whose efforts have flung the logic of public transport being for people, not profit, from wherever it languished back into the civic imagination. So, nice one Burnham!

Keep this up and we even have a little bit of difficulty taking your job;)

Phillip Proudfoot and the Centrist Fury

I want what is best for the people of Hartlepool but also what is best for the whole of the North. I was born in Manchester and have lived in Yorkshire for the past 30 years. Living in London and working in Westminster I saw first- hand that North/South divide. Yes there is of course deprivation and the forgotten towns across the country, but as a Northerner, I'm fed up of our region being under funded across health, transport and education. We need regional funding and an end to centralised Westminster control. We need ownership of our own spending and economy.

I have experience of how Westminster works and see how democracy is being undermined both in Government and, sad to say, in the Labour Party when candidates are being imposed on Labour members.
