[Webinar Recording: Homelessness Prevention - A Case Study from Montgomery County, PA](#)

This webinar highlighted the research and evaluation of homelessness prevention conducted by HealthSpark Foundation and Your Way Home Montgomery County, PA. We heard what prevention meant to the Foundation and why they chose to fund this project. Panelists discussed how they went through the process of setting goals for this research, their approach in reaching out to community members and stakeholders for input, and detailed their findings. We had an in-depth discussion on the local replication of prevention models and the pilot programs currently being launched around eviction prevention and school based prevention.
