



Last week, we hosted our annual Funders Forum in Los Angeles, in conjunction with the National Conference on Ending Family and Youth Homelessness. Seventy individuals representing 34 different foundations and United Ways joined us as we explored philanthropy's role in preventing and ending family and youth homelessness. Keynote speaker, Nisha Patel, shared five strategies to dramatically increase mobility from poverty and led a discussion around how these strategies could impact our efforts to end homelessness.

Participants also had the opportunity to openly share what is working in their communities and where challenges are with HUD officials. In the afternoon, conversations flowed freely as funders gathered in small groups to discuss topics such as building public will, prevention, building a funders network, homelessness and education, and data around family and youth homelessness. The energy in the room as the participants connected was indicative of the passion and excitement with which they approach their work.
