The Child Care Development Fund is the primary federal funding source for subsidized child care. For families experiencing homelessness, this funding can help provide a safe space for children while their parents are at work. More importantly, it helps individuals retain much needed employment to create housing stability. Carie Bires from Ounce of Prevention Fund will discuss how states are utilizing the Child Care Development Fund to support individuals in not only gaining, but retaining employment.

The Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF) program acts as a time limited program to assist families with children when the parents or other responsible relatives cannot provide for the family's basic needs. Some states are making strides in using TANF to help prevent and end homelessness. In this webinar, Elizabeth Lower-Basch, Director of Income and Work Supports at Center for Law and Social Policy, explored how TANF can be used to assist families experiencing homelessness and how philanthropy can leverage these funds.
