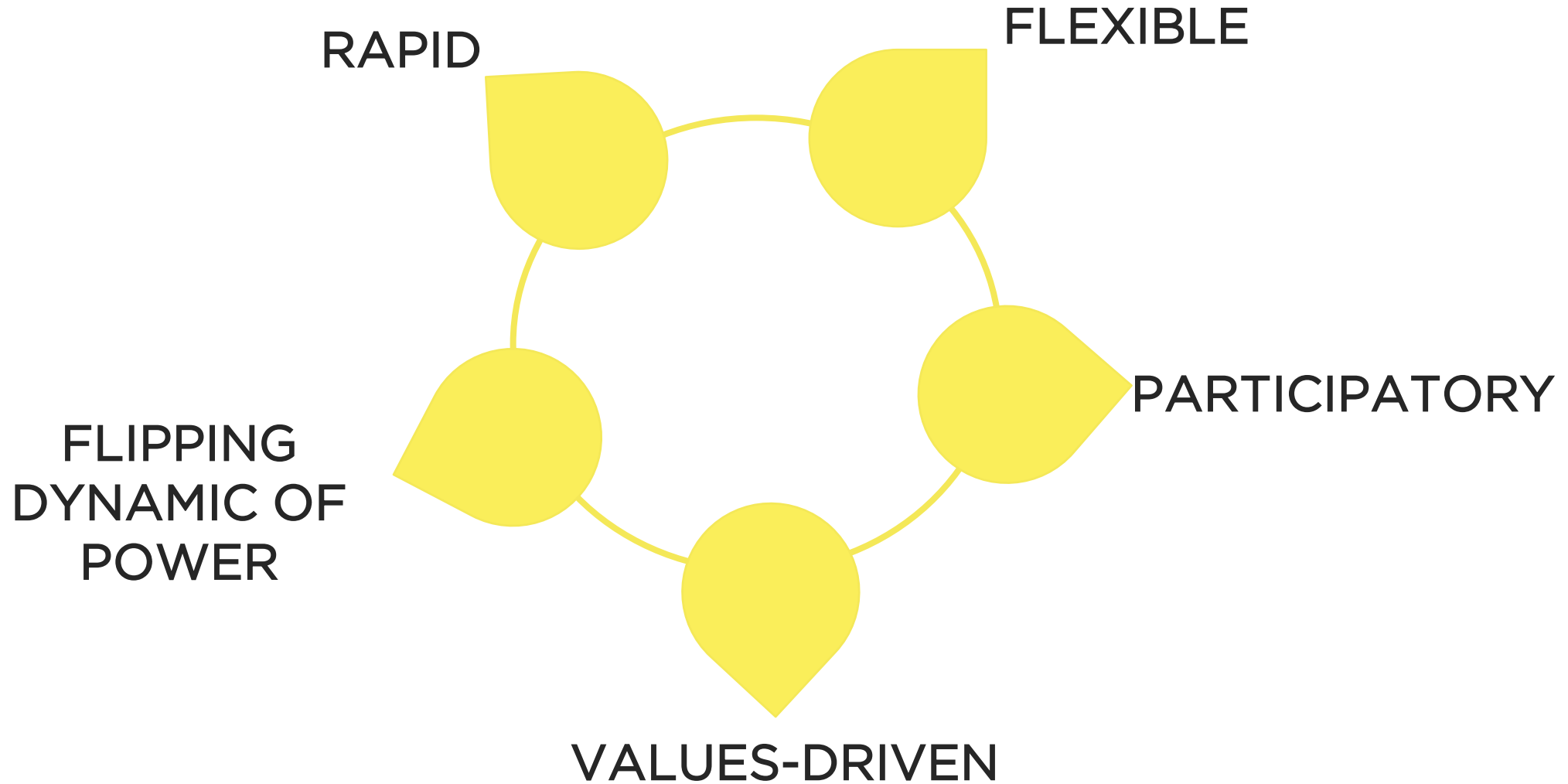

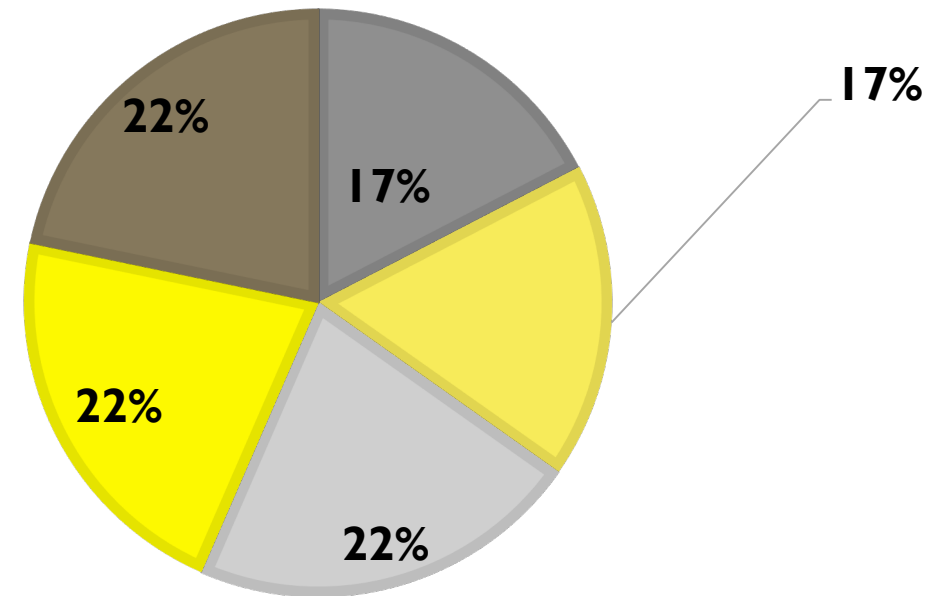

# HOW CAN OTHER FUNDERS ADOPT THE MODEL?

- ❑ Transfer the burden of proof from organizations to funders.
- ❑ Trust the expertise of frontline organizations.
- ❑ Redefine the funder's role from expert to curator
- ❑ Be willing to take risks and support innovation.
- ❑ Practice emergent strategy by challenging issue silos.
- ❑ Prioritize community level funding.
- ❑ Be explicit about power.
- ❑ Reflect and iterate.
