

Our Policies



Education

- **Increase funding of public education** because it's the best investment in the future
- **Improve staffing for disadvantaged schools** by giving teachers incentives to teach in hard to staff areas
- **SORT-Ed** (System of Online Resources for Teachers Education) will allow teachers to share resources so they spend more time doing what they do best: Teaching
- **Programming, Critical thinking & Ethics classes** will give students necessary skills for the future



Housing

- **Allow greater height and density** in developments increase the supply of housing and improve affordability
- **Provide public transport** to new and existing areas to encourage development
- **Decrease construction costs** of new homes by removing unhelpful regulations and taxes
- **Remove stamp duty** and replace it with a simpler and more economically efficient land tax



Transportation

- **Build more rail** to properly service the community
- **Build high-speed rail** connecting Sydney and Newcastle but ultimately extending to Canberra, Melbourne and Brisbane
- **Improve cycling infrastructure** to reduce congestion and improve environmental and health outcomes
- **Support Sydney's second airport** with a new train line and a high-density micro-city in the surrounding non-flight path areas
- **Allow rideshare services to exist legally** and remove taxi license fees to let both drivers and consumers benefit from new technological innovations
- **Encourage research into driverless cars** in NSW to develop the technology for Australian conditions quicker so that we can improve the safety and efficiency of our roads
